# Bulk venture opens

Personalized service is a specialty at a new joint venture business located on Main St. which weds two varied enterprises.  
The street front operation at 223 Main St. is Christopher's Bulk Food Co., specializing in brand name foods customers package themselves.  
This enterprise, unique to the downtown core is backed by Robin's a hair styling boutique.  
The unlikely combination came about when husband and wife, Christopher and Robin Marsh decided to combine their talents in two different businesses at the same location.  
Robin's is a one person operation set in off the street to give customers privacy and one to one service.  
A hair stylist with many years of experience, Robin has operated two shops in Toronto and continues to attract faithful clients from these past endeavors.  
Dealing with one client at a time allows for special attention not found in larger operations.  
Robin concentrates on her customer's specific needs and creates hairstyles which complement life styles. She also offers advice regarding proper hair care and make-up design to suit a hair style.  
A personal data card is filed for each individual customer which details any hair treatments performed by Robin.

Hairdressing is as familiar to Robin as the bulk food business is new to Christopher.  
He has dealt with the public all of his business life, but admits his latest enterprise is a first. He has done his homework however, in the two month planning period prior to the store opening Nov. 22.  
Christopher's aim is to sell good quality products at reasonable prices as well as to provide a service to the downtown which was lacking.  
"It's an opportunity to give old fashioned personal service to a community we enjoy," Christopher explains.  
Pine board floors, panelling and food bins add old fashioned charm to the store which dispenses food in an old time manner.  
The proprietor is proud of the low prices he is able to offer by doing away with expensive packaging.  
Stone ground rye and whole wheat flour, pie fillings, peel, dried and candied fruits are among the products appealing to bakers.  
To satisfy a sweet tooth, mixes of dried fruit and nuts, candies, chocolate milk mixes and cookie mixes are available.  
A selection of spices including 35 varieties, hot and cold cereals, sea salt, whole nutmeg and poppy seeds can also be found among the vast selection at Christopher's Bulk Food Co.
