He's Dr. Zed

Teacheradopts novelapproach

A couple of hair brushes, a dab of white grease make-up, a pair of wire rim glasses, a white lab coat and several sets of helpful hands combine for a dramatic transforma-

Gordon Penrose, a retired master teacher of science becomes Dr. Zed, made possible and witnessed by young audiences across the country.

To thousands of Canadian children, Dr. Zed is a cartoon character featured regularly in Owl magazine for the past six years.

Appearing not unlike that slightly mad scientist, Dr. Zed outlines a new scientific experiment each month using principles like air pressure, heat and friction.

It is the method of getting these science basics across which makes the two-page magazine spread so effective.

Dr. Zed shows the how, why, and what of experimental procedures comprised of easily obtainable equipment.

Simplicity is the all-important factor in Dr. Zed's experiments as they cater to the magazine's readership of eight to 12-year-

Although the publication and Dr. Zed are unknown to many in that age group, the scientist, with a flair for the zany, is busy for two or three days each week changing that.

Day Visit A day-long visit to Robert Baldwin school last week was an example of Dr. Zed's method of stimulating interest in science and at the same time making children aware he exists.

Mr. Penrose's pseudonym and the character attached to it may appear fictitious to his readers, but the message is 100 per cent reality.

"We check each experiment many

times," explains the long-time educator. His cartoon counterpart was created by Annabel Slaight and Mary Anne Brinckman, the magazine's founders and its editor Sylvia Funston. The experiments however, are Mr. Penrose's creations.

He refers to Dr. Zed as a "natural extension" of what he was already doing. That extension culminates in the visual effect achieved at the start of each of Mr. Penrose's performances.

Enchanted

His enchanted audience participates in transforming Mr. Penrose from his average man on the street appearance to the kindly scientist with hair askew and eyebrows exaggerated. Hairbrushes for two volunteers, eye glasses for another, make-up for a fourth and the stereotypic lab coat for another and the group has created a living likeness of the Owl cartoon.

This exercise sets the mood for Dr. Zed's performance, repeated four times during his day at the local public school for a total of eight classes. His audience included special education and grades four and five students.

"I enjoy seeing people become interested in science. They realize how enjoyable it can be. A lot are afraid of science and shy away from it," Mr. Penrose explains as he prepared for his next show.


