

No. 8 Sideroad on Guelph Line. Widening of the Guelph Line and the relocation of the ditch on the east side of Guelph (2) PR-113 Line, a distance of approximately 1,800 feet (548 m), from Colling Road.

The project will also include the reconstruction of Walkers Line 55 m (189 ft.) north of Derry Road and 200 m (656 ft.) south of Derry Road and Appleby Line, a distance of 100 m (328 ft.) north and south of Derry Road.


