Climax Jazz Band coming to town

Due to the enormous success of their previous engagement, Milton Public Library is once again pleased to present the Climax Jazz Band on Friday, Apr. 8 at 8:00 p.m.

The Climax Jazz Band have enjoyed great success since their formation 12 years ago. The Band first began their career at Albert's Hall at the Brunswick Hotel in Toronto and, since then, have been invited to play for gala evenings of both the National Ballet Company and the Canadian Opera Company. They have represented Canada at jazz festivals and clubs in the United States, including New Orleans. Their reputation among Canadian Jazz enthusiasts is legend and they have produced

a total of nine albums. Although the band is Canadian based, it is truly international in scope with its six members hailing originally from London, Cheshire, Edinburgh, the Hague, Dutch East Indies and Cairo. Each of the band members hold down regular jobs by day but get together three or four times a week to play jazz. Their performances reflect the unique comradeship of this talented and fun-loving band.

The Climax Jazz Band's repertoire includes marches, rags, stomps, blues, spirituals and jazz standards and they will gladly answer requests from the audience.
