Unity counts in small business

The voice of small business becomes big and loud when a united front is formed. This was the message Walter Carson, national director of public affairs and ombudsman for the Canadian Organization of Small Business imparted to members of the Milton Chamber of Commerce recently.

Guest speaker at the March meeting of the local chamber, Mr. Carson stressed the impact small business can have on government legislation when a lobby is formed. The organization he represents aids member businesses to form their own lobbying groups.

As the ombudsman for the Canadian Organization of Small Business, Mr. Carson has observed "the process of building a submission to the government is not as complicated as it used to be."

He attributes the change in this process to the fact the government "doesn't have all the answers," and is open to outside input. He stressed confrontation works and "grass roots participation is necessary."

A recent accomplishment of a lobby organized by the organization with a membership of 6,000, was stopping an amendment to the Ontario Human Rights Act which would have required employers to interview all applicants for jobs despite their qualifications.

Commitment needed
Mr. Carson also reminded his audience of the impact a letter to an MP or MPP can have.

"You can make change. Make a commitment, follow it through and convince others to do it too," he said.

He had some words of advice for those not already involved in a small business. Citing the decline in the numbers employed by big business he suggested those now without a job could start their own businesses.

"It would truly be a benefit for all Canadians. Some people feel they can't do this," suggested Mr. Carson.

Those with doubts, he explained are likely "susceptible to the negative influence in other people."

He warned listeners not to be overcome with negative press concerning small business bankruptcies and advised chamber members with small businesses how to avoid financial disaster.

Sticking to a 90-day credit policy is one key afloat in the world of small business according to Mr. Carson. He warned unless a tough stand is taken in this area, "some customers may see you as having a lax credit policy."

"If an account goes into 120 days, quite frankly, you may never see it," he cautioned.

The Canadian Organization of Small Business was founded in 1979 with six members. There are currently 40 supporters in Milton.

Mr. Carson welcomed the opportunity to speak to the chamber as the two organizations "compliment each other."
