TOWN OF HALTON HILLS 1983 TAXES INTERIM BILLING
In accordance with the provisions of The Municipal Act, pursuant to By-law No. 83-2 adopted by Council on January 10th, 1983, the first two instalments of taxes for 1983 will become due as follows:
ALL WARDS - FIRST INSTALMENT FEBRUARY 23RD, 1983 SECOND INSTALMENT APRIL 27TH, 1983
The above instalments represent an interim billing of 1983 taxes based upon one-half of last year's residential mill rates. The final tax bill will be issued about the middle of the year and will also be payable in two instalments, normally the last Wednesday in June and September.
Upon default of payment of the interim tax levy as set out above, a penalty of one and one-quarter (1 1/4) percent of the amount in default shall be added on the first day of default and on the first day of each and every calendar month.
Ratepayers who have not received a tax bill should make immediate application at 36 Main Street South, Georgetown, or by telephone (877-5185 or 453-2411).
PAYMENT OF TAXES
These taxes may be paid at the locations and in the manner detailed on the back of the tax bill.
