

Milton one of first with COED job program in Ontario

Milton is among the first municipalities in Ontario to take part in a Canada-Ontario Employment Development Program (COED) that will see a number of jobs created.

Milton treasurer, Don Lougheed, said the town has already received an "initial" allocation of \$114,976 and it is being spent in three areas.

The first is to fund jobs under existing

town programs, the second is for the winter months, and the third and "umbrella project" Mr. Lougheed said is "exciting."

The third program is called Milton Community Co-operation and it places a number of non-profit community groups under a job funding "umbrella."

The groups listed are The Centre, Milton Lawn Bowling Club, Rotary Club of Milton, Royal Canadian Legion, Linda Moore Group

Home, Optimist Centre, Chamber of Commerce, Halton Women's Place, Italian Canadian Club, and other participants still under negotiation.

"Under this system," Mr. Lougheed said, "the groups will be responsible for materials, pay cards and supervision; the town will provide co-ordination, payroll and accounting; COED will provide the labor costs."

"This proposal has received an enthusiastic response from the community groups involved."

"However, in order for the program to be successful, complete co-operation is essential."

Mr. Lougheed introduced John Lawrence who has been appointed Milton's COED Co-ordinator.

Mr. Lawrence said he sees the program in

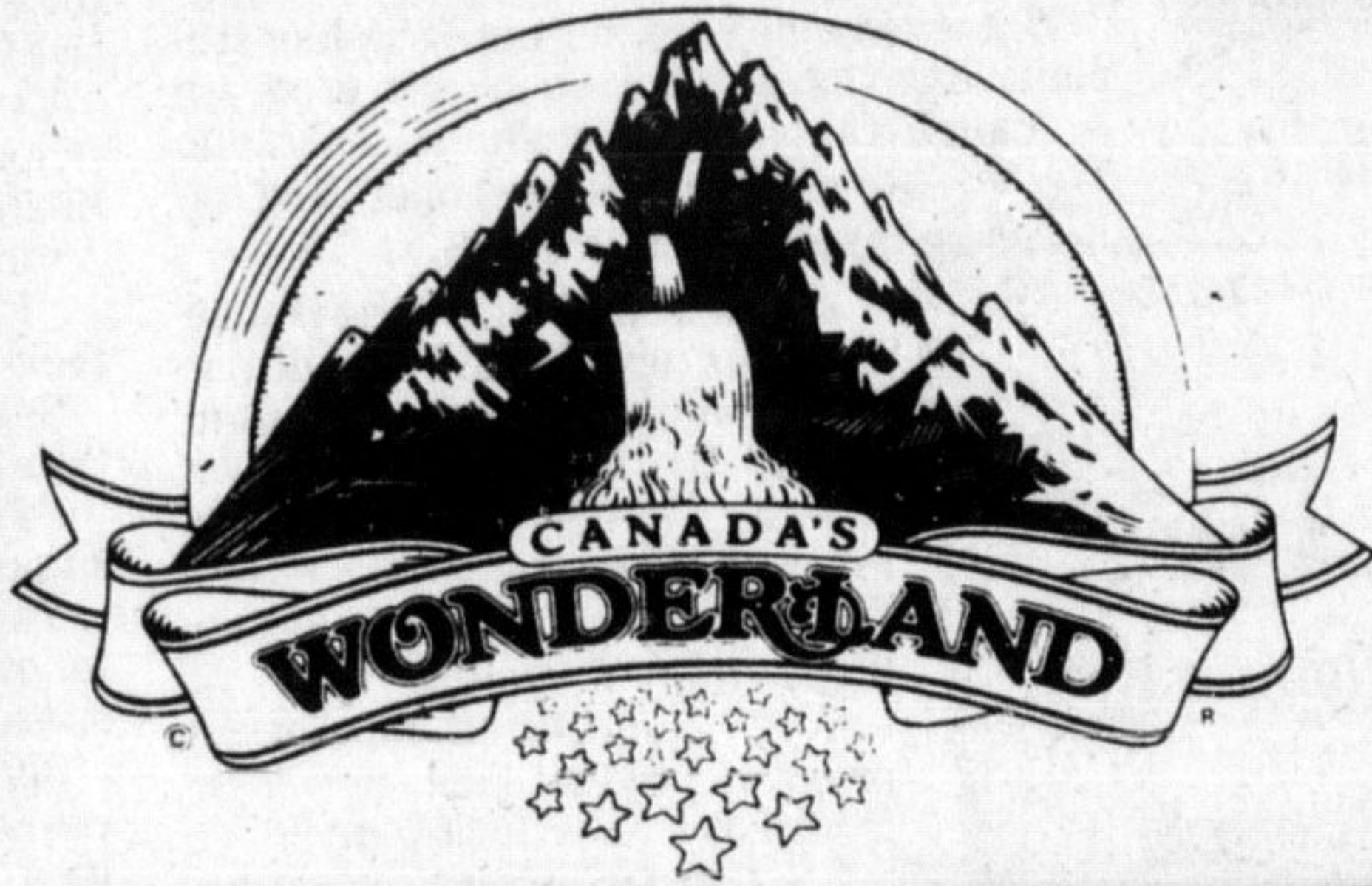
Milton as an "opportunity" to bring work to those in need.

Mr. Lougheed said the COED program in Milton seems to be one of the first to get organized and he said he hoped "we will be the first in Ontario to get it going."

He noted a film crew has already been to Milton to prepare a documentary-informational movie on how the program can be set up.
