HRCA festival is successful

Halton Region Conservation Authority officials are beaming over the success of the Crawford Lake Heritage Festival despite a downpour right in the middle of festivities. The festival was held to mark the first

anniversary of the Authority's founding of a fund to construct an interpretative centre and resurrect a 500 year old Indian Village. The lake is the centre of attraction and is one of only 12 known such lakes in Canada.

The bottom never turns over so the sediment can be brought up in cores and the years can be seen as distinct layers. It was in one of these layers (dated at

roughly 1450 A.D.) that corn pollen was found. This excited researchers because it meant the crop must have been cultivated in the area and that in turn led to the discovery of the Indian Village.

Archaeologists have since found the village contained nine longhouses and it is being rebuilt with some of the longhouses and a palisade. Almost \$270,000 of the \$700,000 required has already been raised. On Sunday, authority spokesman Gary

Hutton said some 2,000 people came out to enjoy the lake and the boardwalk which has been constructed around it. Perhaps the highlight of the day was a

visit by world-renowned wildlife artist Robert Bateman who participated in a cere-

monial tree planting. The festival was also made richer by the visit of the Jim Skye Native Dancers and several native artisans from Oshweken,




