Cyclist improves slightly

World class cyclist Jocelyn Lovell is reported to be in a slightly improved condition at Sunnybrook Hospital in Toronto, following a cycling accident in Milton Aug. 4.

The 33-year-old cyclist who won three gold medals at the 1978 Commonwealth Games in Edmonton and was named Canadian Athlete of the Year in 1975, is listed in serious condition.

Mr. Lovell was bicycling westbound along Britannia Rd. near Trafalgar Rd. when he collided with a dump truck, also westbound, driven by Stephn Dolby of Milton.

Halton Regional Police received a telephone call from a Steeles Ave. farmhouse, after employees of the riding stable reported hearing gun shots.

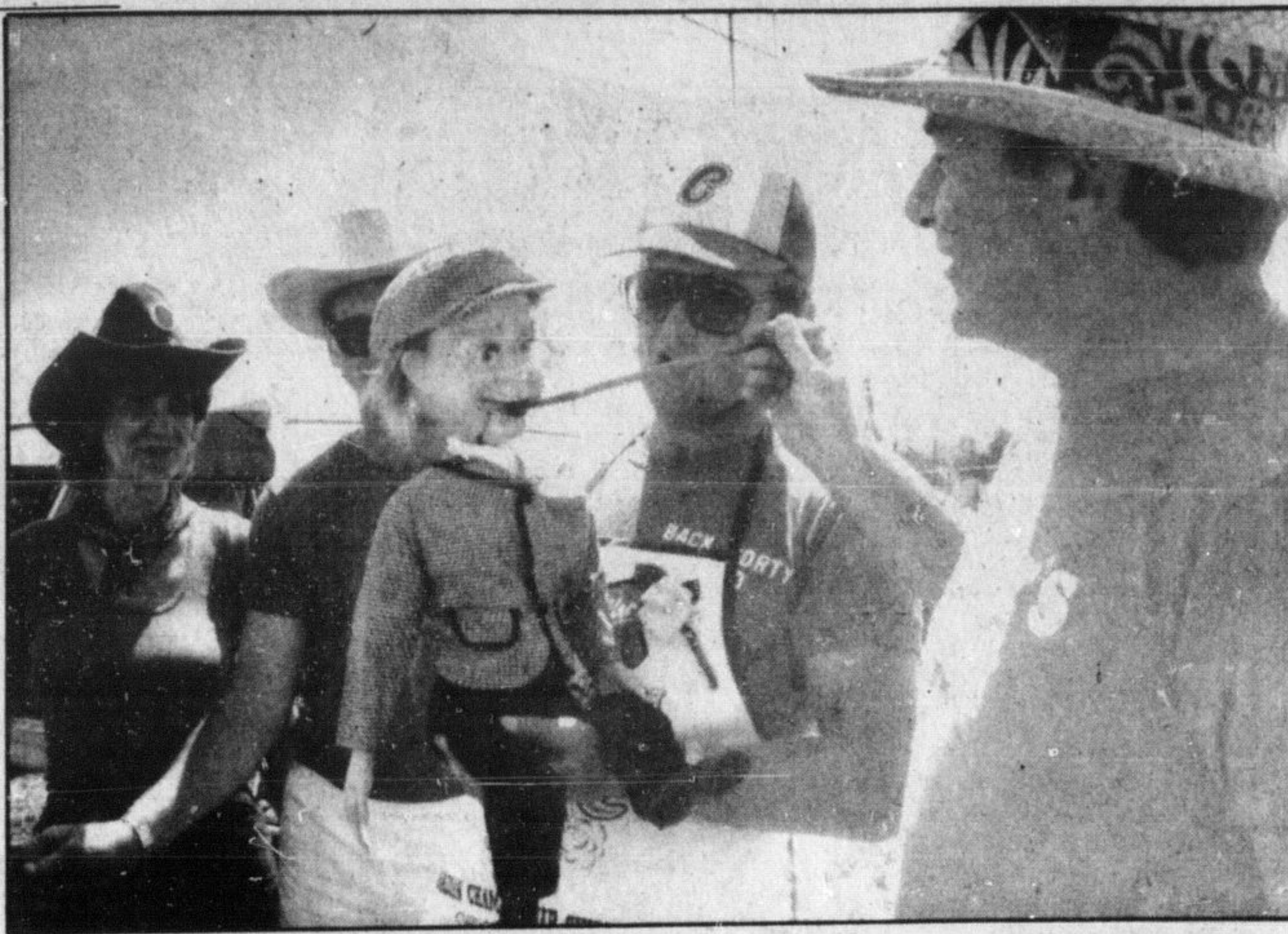
Wheelie

That rate could however, be reduced slightly with an increased user fee (also recommended in the report) and more significantly by government grants.

Among the committee's other recommendations are; negotiations with E.C. Drury begin to provide additional pool time and that this time be rescheduled to provide improved public swim times and programs; ice time be rescheduled to ensure good use of morning and evening times at Laurier and Memorial arenas; a suitable short term

facility be identified as a teen drop-in centre; continued assistance be provided to seniors to help their use of the Legion; meetings to be held with representatives to explore the ways the town Department can be of assistance to arts, culture and theatre groups and ways be explored to accommodate the needs of gymnastic groups.

The comprehensive master plan was tabled by Town Council for further discussion amongst town staff.

It is expected a public forum will be held in the near future to discuss the plan.

No date has been set for that meeting.

Wandering kids need walk

At cookoffs

Texan takes chili laurels

The Texans triumphed with their tongue tingling bowls of red at the Canadian Chili Cook-off Championship held in Milton on Saturday.

Entrants from south of the border had an edge as the contest was based on "Texas Style Chili", meaning no beans, rice or fillers of any kind were allowed. Simply sauce and cubes of beef formed the base for the Texas red.

More than 20 pots of chili were brewing until 3 p.m. at the grounds of Halton Hills Place, giving visitors a chance to sample the efforts of first time competitors to reigning champions.

The event of course was sanctioned by the Chili Appreciation Society International, Dallas Texas.

The "first ever fifth annual" cook-off was organized by CFGM radio and Milton Lions Club and attracted locals from places like Campbellville, Freeton, Brampton and Caledon along with the culinary champs from Texas.

Judges were looking for taste, aroma, colour, consistency, heat and after taste in the winning concoctions. Giving the more local entrants a break, however, showmanship was judged for first, second and third place as well.

The top chili cook was found to be Bill "Ice Tea" Douglas, a solo entry from Texas, followed by 1981 Texas Chili Champ Lonni Gibbs and his wife Carol of Texas.

Cook-off chairman Bill McKeown of Milton Lions Club said one of the contenders from Texas only made it as far as New York but if he'd reached his Milton destination he likely would have taken home third spot. Instead the honor went to a pair of police

officers from Bala who've been priming their chili cooking style for four years.

John Lennox, Bev Groves and his wife Val were aiming for a triple crown having won two cook-off firsts already this year. They had to settle with third and be content to be the only winners who could take advantage of the prize of a trip to Texas in the cooking competition.

Bruce Durling of Brampton with his Black Angus crew and jail display won for showmanship. He'll also go to Texas.

Placing second for showmanship was a group from Port Perry calling themselves Texas Red Ass. Milton resident Roy Whitney took third with a hillbilly theme.

The day-long event was followed by a dance.

Cops seize grass cache
