

Milton slow to implement

Newsprint dump ban is extended

A plan to ban newsprint in municipal garbage in Milton has been delayed again. Members of the region's solid waste management committee agreed last week to delay institution of the ban until Nov. 1. It was originally to have come into effect Sept. 1.

The newsprint ban is part of the region's long-term plan for handling garbage by separating material which can be recycled. In a report to the committee, public works

director Bob Moore said all municipalities, except Milton, now have programs for separating newsprint from regular garbage and collecting it at the curb side.

"While we are disappointed that Milton has not yet been able to start curb side collections in the urban area of town; however in view of the progress that they are making towards the implementation of a combined depot/curb side pick up program, we are

satisfied to recommend a further short term deferral of newsprint ban," he wrote.

Milton had not been entirely ignoring the need to recycle resources, he noted, and has established depots in the town for the collection of newsprint and glass.

Plans are also being made to take over the role of a citizens group in the north which has been promoting recycling for several years.

Economy aids dump

A slump in business activity this year could mean a slightly longer lifespan for Halton's single remaining landfill site. Members of the solid waste management committee were told last week it is now predicted the site will have to be closed in August of next year.

Earlier predictions had called for the gates to be locked for the final time in June. In a written report, public works director Bob Moore said the amount of garbage being buried in the site has fallen by 18 per cent over last year, which will allow for the slightly longer life.

This drop, he wrote, could be attributed to several factors, including the increasing effectiveness of source separation programs and the increased cost of hauling garbage to Burlington forcing businesses to reduce the total amount they discard.

A plan is already being developed to expand the site to serve for another four years while a provincial hearing body reaches a decision on regional plans from a new site to be located in a spot being investigated now.

Disaster assistance approved

Halton residents who are treated to the sight of raw sewage bubbling up out of their toilets in the future will be able to get some assistance from the region.

Members of the administration and finance committee last week approved payment of disaster relief grants to homeowners who experience such problems in the future.

The grants, to a maximum of \$250, will be paid only when the regional chairman declares an event to be a community disaster.

The funds will cover the cost of immediate clean ups and out of pocket expenses, provided the residents first sign a waiver acknowledging payment of the grant is not an admission by the region of responsibility for the problem.

Chase ends in court

A 16-year-old Milton youth charged with robbing and threatening a local man; stealing a pick-up truck from a local business and leading police on a high speed chase in Oakville, will be sentenced next month.

Daniel Paul Chlon of First Line pleaded guilty to stealing the wallet of Cecil Joubert of 122 Bronte St. April 18; stealing a pick-up truck owned by Gus Mowbray Ltd., of Milton, June 20 and causing a police chase through Oakville streets June 21.

During the course of the chase, the young teenager ran two red lights and failed to pull over, for police. He eventually fled on foot after reversing the truck into the cruiser. He was later apprehended by police. Damage to the cruiser and the truck amounted to approximately \$1,000.

Provincial Court Judge Bill Sharpe agreed to a request for a pre-sentence report on the youth.

In accordance with dangerous driving offence he immediately loses his licence for a three month period and a further three year period—the penalty for leading police on a chase.

He will be sentenced on all charges Tuesday, Sept. 13 at 11 a.m.
