

Midget girls hold on in 7th to capture Halton softball crown

Coming through in fine style, Milton's midget girls' softball reps captured the Halton championship with a nail-biting 6-4 win in the championship game against Hornby recently at Cheltenham.

Milton built a 6-0 lead and then watched Hornby score four runs in the bottom of the seventh inning to nearly pull the win out of the fire.

The victory avenged a 12-1 loss Milton suffered to Hornby in the second game of the tourney. Milton won the opener 13-6 against Cheltenham and also beat Cheltenham 25-13 in the third game to advance to the final against Hornby.

In the final, Milton took command with a 4-0 lead in the top half of the first inning. The first four batters in the game, Cindy Riley, Moe Smith, Debbie Blair and Debbie Allen, each reached base and scored. Susan Blair belted a homer in the fifth for another run before Smith scored in the sixth inning to give Milton the six-run lead.

Hornby waited until the seventh inning before connecting with any success off Milton hurler Sharon Haringa. Three errors and a walk to the first four batters, Lori Williams, Michelle May, Jo-ann Emerson and Kim Hamilton, put them on base where they eventually scored. Haringa enticed Janice Riebot and Kim Gervais to pop up for outs before Jackie Chudleigh delivered two runs with a single. Lori Annable ended the game when her line drive was nabbed by shortstop Debbie Blair for the final out.

In the third game, Milton scored 18 runs in the first three innings to run away from Cheltenham. Every batter, except Kim Rea, scored at least one run. Simpson pitched the complete game.

Milton's only blemish during the weekend-

long tourney was its second-game loss to Hornby. Milton was held to just six hits with Debbie Allen's solo homer accounting for the only run.

Hornby scored in every inning with Michelle May leading the way with three runs scored. Michelle Dupuis, Kim Hamilton, Helen Rayner and Cheryl Robinson added two runs each.

In Milton's opener, Debbie Allen hit two homers and scored three runs to pace the club over Cheltenham 13-6. Debbie Blair

also added three runs while Susan Blair and Maureen Smith scored twice each. Sharon Haringa went the distance on the mound for Milton to gain the win.

The victory climaxed a successful season for the team which finished with a 17-1 league record. It was the best Milton record in three years which is even more remarkable in that this club was almost dissolved when it appeared no coach could be found. Les Wilson stepped in and took over the reins.
