Halton dump fight now taking shape

A battle is shaping up over the proposed expansion of the Burlington dump site.

Recently Burlington council voted against the expansion in favor of exporting garbage to an energy from waste facility in Niagara Falls, New York, but the general committee of Oakville council has voted in favor of the four-phase expansion of the Aldershot site.

Halton Region is seeking input from the area municipalities on the interim waste disposal plan, which is necessary to accommodate the region's garbage from 1984, when the Burlington site is

scheduled to be filled under its current dimensions, and 1988, when Halton will hopefully have a new facility in place.

Oakville's director of public works Hal Ellis has recommended that Oakville council support the expansion because it is a "reasonable and practical" solution, but Burlington council maintains that the time for temporary solutions is over.

Arguments against the exporting option have been based on the expense of the proposal, but Burlington Councillor Walter Burkewich, chairman of the city's solid waste management committee, says the expense has yet to be proven.
