
Tickets are \$5, but only \$3.50 for senior citizens and students. They can be purchased at Can Travel at the Milton Mall and at the door.

Hydro running wild, MPP tells meeting

Halton-Burlington MPP Julian Reed lashed out at Ontario Hydro at a recent meeting of the Oakville Provincial Liberal Association.

"There is no doubt in my mind that the government is allowing an uncontrollable spending program by Hydro," Mr. Reed told a scant gathering at Oakville Trafalgar High School.

"I can easily predict the price of electricity will double by the end of the decade," he added.

Mr. Reed predicted the provincial Liberal party, under the direction of leader David Peterson, will be challenging the govern-Peterson, will be challenging the government this fall about Ontario Hydro.

"The issues will be more broadly based, but I can assure you that Ontario Hydro will be top ranking," said Mr. Reed.

Currently national resources critic for the provincial opposition, the Norval resident served for six years as energy critic and four of those years on the Hydro select committee-a type of hydro watchdog committee that was disbanded.

"We have said that this committee should be reconvened," said Mr. Reed. "We need to bring back some kind of public scrutiny." Another goal of the Liberals will be to try to introduce an act respecting Hydro ac-

countability to the Legislature. According to Mr. Reed, the Minister of Energy cannot speak on behalf of Ontario Hydro in the Legislature and does not have

the power to defend the crown corporation. "Under the legislature that created Ontario Hydro, they are not answerable to the Minister," Mr. Reed said after the meeting. "The minister can act as a news bearer

and that's all," he added. He said the only type of "peripheral" control is exerted by the Ontario Energy Board, but Mr. Reed said Ontario Hydro can withhold some information.

"In effect, they can thumb their noses at them," he said.

It is for this reason the opposition will try this fall to have the Power Corporation Act amended to have Ontario Hydro develop a

"clear cut policy." Mr. Reed pointed to Hydro's debt capacity ration, which he maintains has "escalated" since he has been in the Legislature.

"And the government is continuing to allow these facilities to continue unchecked," he said.
