## Martha Gleeson honoured for b-ball coaching success

A Milton basketball coach was recently honored by Canada's top hoopsters.

Martha Gleeson was one of just 10 instructors province-wide to receive a coach-of-the-year award from the Toronto Raptors April 8 at SkyDome, during their showdown with the Washington Bullets.

While the Ontario Basketball Association (OBA) has recognized outstanding coaching in the past, this was the first year they coordinated the presentations with the local NBA franchise.

Gleeson, the heart and soul of the Milton Monarch program, was named top midget coach in the entire province. Her commemorative plaque - signed by Isiah Thomas — was presented by Toronto's public relations manager Al Quance at half time.

"It (the award) came as a big surprise, I'm not even sure who nominated me," said Gleeson, a longtime coach at both the high school and club level. "Being out there at half court and receiving an award was quite a thrill."

Her initiation into coaching followed a remarkable playing career at Leamington High School, and later with Western University where she helped the Mustangs win three national titles. She split her duties between player and coach during the last of those championships.

After successful periods instructing in Brantford and Preston she moved to Milton, where among numerous accolades she led Our Lady of Victory's boys team to a regional championship and the league finals.

One of her best memories — in her 30-plus years in basketball — came three years ago when she led the Monarch bantam girls to the gold medal at the AA Ontario championships.

"I really thought we were only a single A team that year, but the girls played their hearts out and just kept winning," Gleeson recalled.

Along with husband Pat, whom she describes as a "master strategist", Gleeson has not only coached hundreds of provincial hoopsters but all four of her chil-

Of those who have come through the Monarch program and benefited from Gleeson's expertise, no less than 22 have played or are playing at the college or university level.




