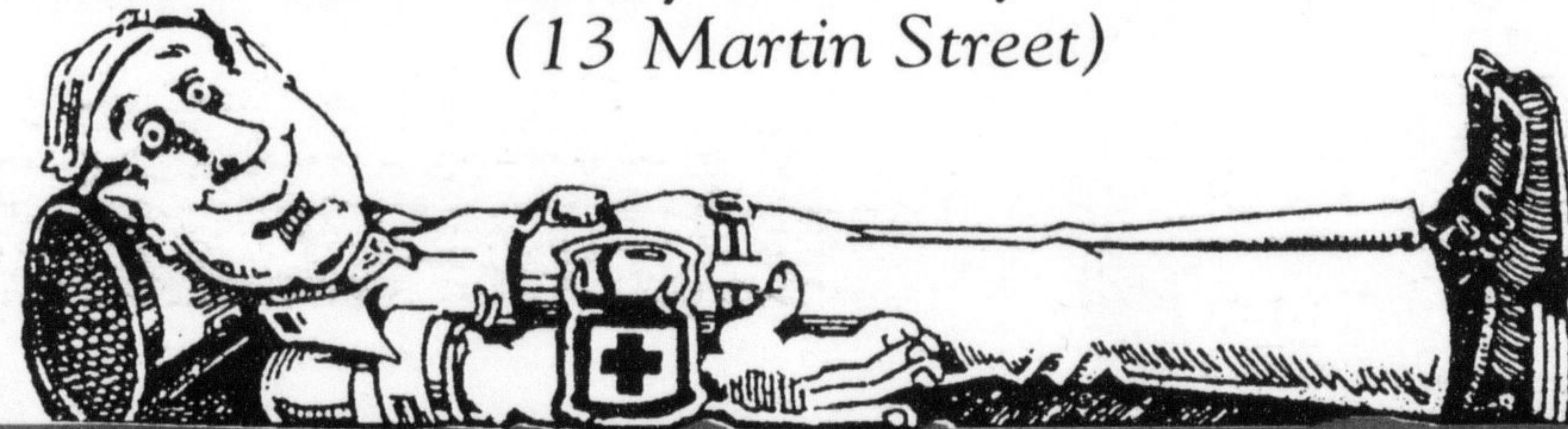

Well-heeled driver

A joint OPP investigation is underway into the mysterious discovery of \$20,000 in a drunk driving suspect's pocket.

Milton OPP found the money after responding to a single-vehicle crash in which the car rolled over on the westbound Hwy. 401, just west of Trafalgar Road, Thursday at 10:40 p.m.

Two Milton OPP officers and one from Port Credit are investigating the mysterious circumstances surrounding the money.

"The suspect claims to have no knowledge of how it got there," said Constable Brian Hackett of the Port Credit OPP.

A 48-year-old Georgetown man is charged with impaired driving, refusing to provide a breath sample and driving under suspension.
