WEED CONTROL NOTICE TO PROPERTY OWNERS

THE ONTARIO WEED CONTROL ACT AS IT APPLIES TO PERSONS IN POSSESSION OF LAND WITHIN THE TOWN OF HALTON HILLS

Unless noxious weeds are destroyed by June 2nd, 1997 and as often as necessary throughout the season to prevent the ripening of their seeds and dispersal of their pollens, the Town of Halton Hills may enter private property and destroy these weeds. The costs will be charged against the property owner and collected in the manner of municipal taxes.

The Weed Control Act creates an offence for persons who contravene the Act or the regulations. The Town may proceed with legal action against any owner or person who fails to comply with the Act.

Goats beard, thistles, poison ivy, ragweed, wild carrot and milkweed are among the weeds considered noxious, and must be destroyed wherever found. Complaints regarding dandelion and golden rod will not be accepted as these are not considered noxious under the terms of The Weed Control Act.

Anonymous complaints will not be accepted. Any concerns please direct enquiries to Ron McKnight at extension 370.
