Frogs are in full voice at Crawford Lake

Visit Crawford Lake Conservation Area during the "Season of Many Frogs Peeping" and discover more than a beautiful and fascinating Niagara Escarpment park. The spring program takes place on weekends and holidays until June 22, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Information booklets are available to assist with wildflower identification and to learn some fascinating characteristics and traditional uses of these spring gems.

The reconstructed Iroquoian village is a place of discovery anytime of the year but especially during the spring.

This is the time for planting "The Three Sisters" garden. The "sisters" include corn, beans and squash, which were vital to the agricultural people of the longhouse.

Informative video presentations and fun crafts for kids will also be offered during the Season of Many Frogs Peeping. The Conservation Centre is open on weekends and holidays so that visitors can enjoy the many displays and exhibits, view a slideshow, browse in the unique gift shop or enjoy a tasty snack in the cafe.

All-terrain wheelchairs are also available for on-site use and can be reserved at no charge. For further information, call Crawford Lake at 905-854-0234 (weekends and holidays) or the Conservation Authority Administration Office on weekdays at 905-336-1158.

Admission to the park is \$4/adult; \$3.25/student (13 and over) and seniors (65 and over); \$2.75/child (12 and under) and preschoolers are free. Crawford Lake is located on Steeles Ave. and Guelph Line, just 5 km south of Hwy. 401.

LOOKING FOR A JOB? By Keri Simpson

"Every time I apply for a job, I never get it!" Does this sound familiar? A lot of students feel discouraged about their first job search. It can be a very stressful experience. Commonly asked questions by students at the Human Resource Centre for Students are...

"Do I need a resume?"

Yes, a resume can be a useful tool to any employer. The resume sets you up, and shows the employer your strengths. A cover letter is also a good thing to include with your resume. The cover letter introduces yourself to the potential employer. It tells the reader why you are applying for that job.

"Do I need to prepare for an interview?"

Yes! Find out what the dress code is and dress appropriately. Make sure you bring a copy of your resume with you, as well as a list of your references. It is a good idea to bring a pad of paper and a pen, in case you need to write anything down. You don't want to look unprepared!

Remember, first impressions are lasting ones!! Smile, give a firm handshake, look the interviewer in the eye, be pleasant!

"Do I just wait to hear from them?"

No. Tell them you will be in touch later that week. Call or write back thanking them for the interview and for their time. This will remind them of you and keep your interview fresh in their mind.

"What happens if I don't get the job?"

Do not worry, just try again. Take it as a practice run and see what you can improve on. Don't forget that you can always come in to get extra help with interview skills, and resume writing from one of the Summer Employment Officers at the centre.
