Councils will join lobby group

The Halton Catholic school board has agreed to spend \$1,550 to provide its parent councils with a provincial voice. Trustees agreed to spend \$50 per school to enrol parent councils in the Ontario Federation of Catholic School Associations, following a request from the federation recently.

"This is a precarious time for education," federation president Mary Ann Cuderman told trustees. "In order

to save and enhance our system of Catholic education, we need a strong provincial voice of parents."

While Catholic parents are also represented by a provincially-appointed body known as the Ontario Parent Council, Ms Cuderman said Catholic parents need their own association. Board chair Don Schrenk, who supported the motion, noted that the federation fills "a very real need in the Catholic community."
