




























ANOTHER LONG SCHOOL YEAR DRAWS TO AN END

This semester however, was different from any other I have completed-I will actually be sad to see it end.


For the past few months I and several dozen fellow Milton students, have been participating in a co-operative education program. Since late February I have been working in the editorial department here, at the Canadian Champion.
