Halton than elsewhere but that is because Halton is a small, affluent community."

Burlington Mayor Walter Mulkewich said data in the report is so fuzzy and vague that it is not really data at all. Mr. Katsop admitted that much of the data had no standard against which it is judged. The idea is to develop the tools to measure and then compare statistics so perhaps a standard can be agreed upon.

"Someone will have to make decisions on what is data and what is opinion," said Mayor Mulkewich. "Wouldn't it be better to pick a few key areas and set some standards?"

Linda Rothney of the Halton District Health Council said people need to feel passionate about issues, and

not just issues picked by bureaucrats.

"Halton has a good quality of life but we can push the envelope," she said. "We can use this as a benchmark."

Burlington Councillor Jack Dennison said many survey questions, especially those directed to young people, were worded so as to provide obvious answers.

"This is the first step," said Halton chair Joyce Savoline. "The grunt work has been done. This report begs questions. There needs to be a political will to drive this."

In future the report will be updated every three years. It is expected that indicators will eventually show a trend on Halton's relative standing.
