



Court hears cops plotted to suppress the evidence

High ranking Halton Regional Police officers plotted to cover up a detective's assault on a murder suspect, court heard Friday.

Now retired Inspector Les Graham led a plan to hide Det. Doug Ford's videotaped face slap of a young man during an interrogation, Det. John Stonehill testified in Ontario court (provincial division) in Milton.

Det. Stonehill broke down on the stand and wept after recalling that he wanted no part of the alleged plot by Insp. Graham and a second officer, Det. Sgt. Bob Waller, to get rid of the video-taped evidence.

"We're not going to let a s— head like this ruin a good officer's career," Det. Stonehill was quoted in the Toronto Star describing what Insp. Graham told him during a meeting alone.

"I didn't know what to say to Les. I knew that the interview had been recorded on video," Det. Stonehill told Crown Attorney Ian Scott.

According to a report in the Star, Det. Stonehill told Mr. Scott during his testimony that Insp. Graham was

his longtime friend, then began to cry.

Charged with attempting to obstruct justice, Insp. Graham was the head of the major crime unit based at Halton's head office in Oakville when a murder suspect was brought in for questioning in 1995.

Det. Sgt. Waller, then one of the lead investigators in the first-degree-


