Region officials worried about road costs

Halton's Region's public works staff have suggested Highway 25 be renamed Central Halton Parkway.

But regional officials are also worried that whatever the names attached to provincial roads Halton takes over, the bottom line will spell risk.

Deliberations over road

names are perhaps the tip of the iceberg in regional discussions as Halton prepares to take over all of two provincial highways serving the area.

Regional councillors have strong reservations about tackling the financing of upkeep for the heavily used thoroughfares.

According to a report by Brent Marshall, acting commissioner of public works, the Hwy. 25 change would be in

effect north of the Queen Elizabeth Way and only outside the urban areas of Milton and Acton.

Advertising the suggested name change and inviting public comment will be delayed until September to get the widest possible input, according to Mr. Marshall.

Mr. Marshall's suggestion comes on the heels of an announcement from the provincial government to switch responsibility for Highway 25 and Highway 5 to municipalities.

of Acton on January 1, 1998.

On that date they will also cede control of a 22-kilometer section of Highway 5 which crosses Halton.

Regional officials say they are waiting on an announcement for Highway 7.

Mr. Marshall's report also suggests that regional road designations be altered to avoid confusion, making Highway 25, Regional Road 25, similarly Highway 5 would become Regional Road 5.

Shift premature

Members of the planning and public works committee agreed that Halton Chair Joyce Savoline should arrange a meeting with Minister of Transportation Al Palladini to stress that the Region feels it is premature to shift Highway 5 away from provincial jurisdiction.

"Highway 5 is not a local road. It carries a great number of vehicles in place of Highway 407," said Burlington

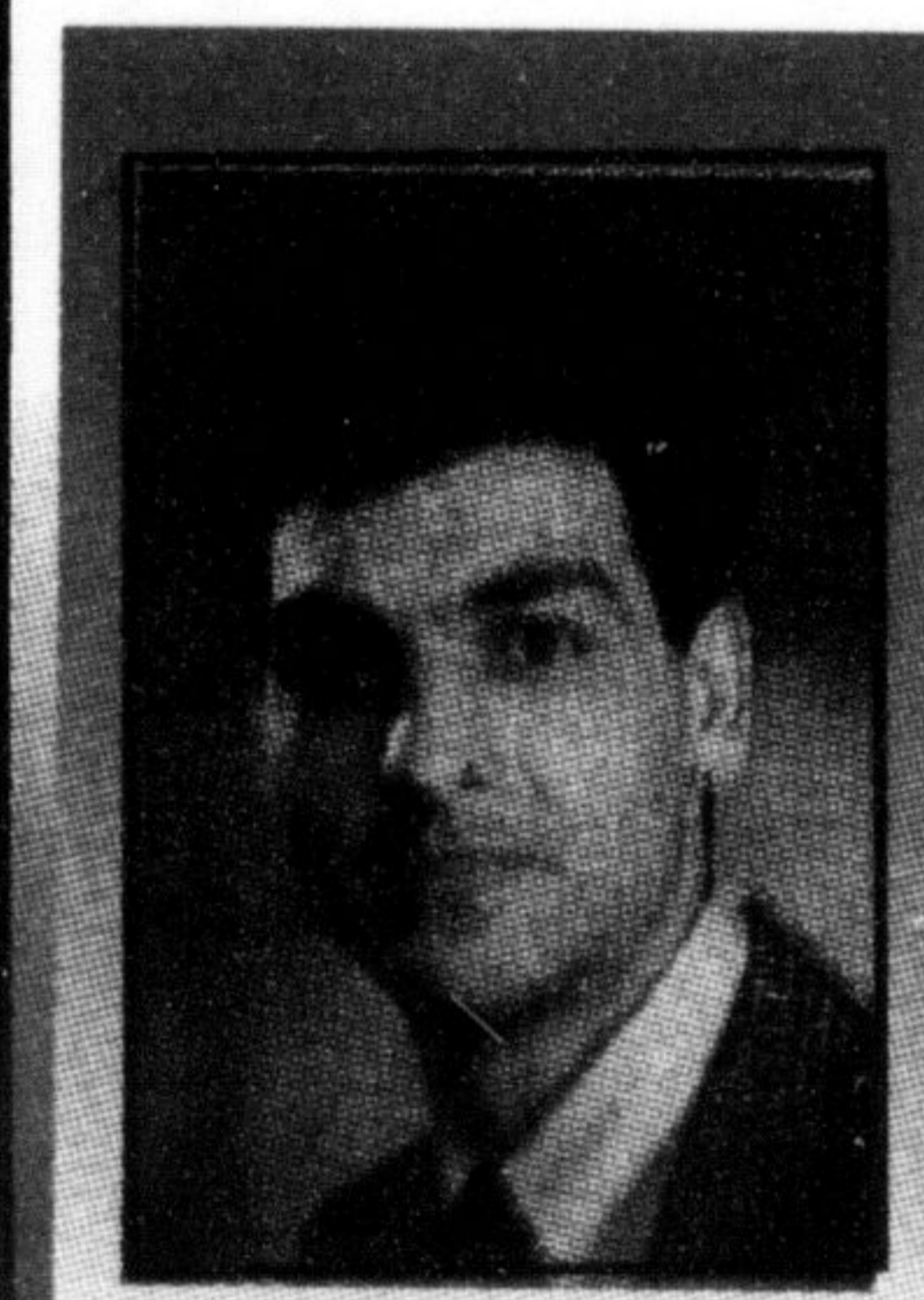
Region takes over

Halton took control of a 14-kilometer section of Highway 25 from the QEW to Derry Road on July 1.

The Region now controls the planning, operation, maintenance and policing of the roadway.

The provincial government will transfer the rest of Highway 25, a 15-kilometer section between Milton and Acton and a short stretch north
