"To be working for a little kid as great as David, after all he's been through, is a great feeling," said Craig Hardy, the head carpenter from London, who met David for the first time last week. "This was worth getting up at five in the morning

A team of seven workers from the Ancaster Home Depot was just as enthusiastic about the project.

"We really wanted to help out, because it was just such a great idea," said Jim O'Keefe, the team co-ordinator. "Building the barn seemed to be the best way."

Even though most of the day was organized in advance by the Make-A-Wish Foundation, people and businesses in the community that had heard of David and Patrick went that extra mile at the last minute to make the day a success.

After reading about David last week in The Burlington Post, Branthaven Homes offered to help with the barn, and came through with a much-needed donation of cedar wood for the donkey paddock.

Then, when June went into the Loeb grocery store on Upper Middle Road to get supplies for Sunday, she was met with yet another heart-warming surprise.

"Agnes Forester, the manager, insisted on donating everything we needed," said June. 'The store gave us over \$200 dollars worth of groceries and paper plates, and she said if we needed any more to just come back anytime during the day. I couldn't believe it."

As for David, he was just perfectly happy to be with his best friend, Patrick. The donkey had been brought to the Parmleys' home that morning by the owner, Bruce Owen of Milton, who has given the donkey to David. David was all smiles as Mr. Owen took him around in a cart hooked up to Patrick.

David even got special attention from two of his favourite former physical therapists, Katherine Rolls and Liz Robinson, who travelled from London. Upon her arrival, Robinson surprised David with two cakes, one modelled after Patrick the donkey, and the other a three-dimensional red barn, complete with little candy donkeys, hay (cereal) and candy grass.

"That's the kind of thing that amazes me so much," said June. "The community has been so supportive, and everybody's gone out of their way to make David happy."

With the barn and paddock nearly complete, David and his father, Merv, plan to have a sleep-over in the barn with Patrick.

"I think that was my idea," he laughed "Whenever we mention it to David, he gets so excited. He loves that animal. We'll always be grateful to everyone who helped in bringing Patrick home for David, to everyone in the community."

## Owner arrested

A 47-year-old Mississauga man has been arrested in connection with a multi-million dollar house fire in rural Milton last February.

He was taken into custody Thursday by Halton Regional Police, who have conducted a joint investigation with the Ontario Fire Marshal's Office since the blaze.

The suspect is the owner of the Ennisclaire estate property, which was engulfed by flames as a result of the fire.

The house burned for seven hours, with the financial loss estimated at \$3 million.

He has been charged with arson for fraudulent purposes and will appear in Milton Court Monday, Sept. 29.
