Milton under Andress' wing

Staff Inspector Ray Andress, Halton Regional Police, District One, has Milton under his wing again.

As of January 13 Milton joins Georgetown as part of Dis-trict One. It is important to note this is the former town of

Milton and Nassagaweya Township is not included. "This is just a case of Milton being under my supervision

again," Andress explained. Mr. Andress served as the chief of Milton Police for 14 years prior to the formation of the Halton Regional Police. He began his career as a law enforcement officer in July, 1953. Mr. Andress has been head of the Georgetown Detachment since 1974.

A target date has been set of September 1975 for the District One department to take over the rest of Halton Hills. At present the regional police operate in only Georgetown and Milton in north Halton.

Mr. Andress said it would take time and a gradual takeover is anticipated for Nassagaweya.


