
### Brampton beaten

Brampton Vic Wood was the victim Friday night as the Milton Continental Flyers ended their eight game losing streak. Flyers skated away with a 9-4 win at Milton Memorial Arena. For the Flyers it was their first point since tying the Flower Towners 6-6 on their home ice Dec. 29 and their first win since edging Streetsville 3-2 Dec. 10.

Things started right for the Flyers when Brent Murray's shot from the blueline found its way to the Brampton goal with only 21 seconds ticked off the clock.






