Mike Kendrick award winner and valedictorian at Milton High School's 55th commencement Friday

It's commencement time again at Milton District High School. The word itself denotes a new beginning and for 79 grade 13 graduates, this year has meant just that.

A total of 54 of the 79 are continuing their studies at colleges and universities in Toronto, London, Waterloo, Kingston and Peterborough. The remainder are already in the working world.

This year at MDHS there are 28 Ontario Scholars, students with marks of 80 per cent and over in six credits. Many of these young people will be receiving awards and scholarships Friday night

along with their OSA certificate and \$100.

Valedictorian Valedictorian for 1975 is 19year-old Mike Kendrick, an Ontario Scholar and winner of the Ted Hood memorial award for good academic and athletic standing, and the Student Council award for participation.

Chosen by teachers and classmates alike, Mike is in a general science program at the University of Toronto. He's the son of Betty and George Kendrick of Milton and has attended J. M. Denyes and Martin St.

Highest standing Bill Fay holds the highest standing in 1975 with a 92.2 per cent average. Bill is also 19 and will be receiving the Halton Board of Education proficiency prize, the Pickett Shield for highest standing in grade 13, and his Ontario scholarship. He shares with Vera Jensen the Ray Deumer memorial award and plaque

for highest geography mark. Bill is the son of Charles and Margaret Fay and is studying civil engineering at the University of Waterloo.

Scholastic success runs in the Fay family. His brother Don, now a teacher at Belle River District High School, was valedictorian when he graduated some years ago from MDHS and was awarded the Terry Deslaurier Award for personality, a special honor that has been given only once in the past seven years.

Bill's sister Maryanne received a leadership award at MDHS and is now a registered nurse in Toronto.

Second highest grade 13 standing was earned by Jane McCarthy with 90.8 per cent. Secondary School Graduation Diplomas will be given to 201 students who have completed their grade 12 courses of study. Honor diplomas go to 79 students.

Top grade 12 Top grade 12 student is Mike Rigo with 88.8 per cent. An honors student throughout his life, he graduated from Holy Rosary School with a 92.5 average.

Mike is the winner of three awards given for highest standing, the Halton Board of Education proficiency prize for grade 12, the George Dawson shield and the student council honor roll plaque. He is at MDHS this year completing his grade 13 and plans to go to University of Waterloo to study engin-

eering and computer science. The son of Alfred and Hilda Rigo, Mike has an older sister Roseanne who was top graduate in 1971 with a 93.5 per cent average. She is studying mathematics at the University of Waterloo.

Both Rigos seem to be gifted in mathematics with Mike's marks seldom slipping below 97.

Wollaston boys The Wollaston family is another where the awards are


