
## IN GERMANY

Toy-making is a great industry in Germany. The districts which are the centers of this ancient folk art are old farming country. This is why the majority of German toys reflect the objects of the old farmsteads: cows and horses, drivers and carts, house and stable and woods and wild game. The German toy area is located for the most part in the Great Forest districts, and though modern methods are behind these activities, the makers retain the old simplicity of design which is characteristic of the present made toy.
