Sullivan did go toe-to-toe with Marc Varteressian, who jumped him from behind for taking the stick to veteran winger Jay Stewart.


Neither player scored a clear decision as linesmen conspired to defray the fight.

The veteran fullback — a regular contributor on the score sheet — suffered a season-ending broken ankle during a second-quarter sideline tackle.



Leading the charge for the 'Stangs were quarterback Adam Gertzbein and




