Tanker wheels stolen

A thief in need of truck tires targeted a Milton yard last month, and managed to get away with quite a haul..

Crime Stoppers hopes someone can help identify whoever was involved.

Between 6 p.m. Saturday, Oct. 11 and 6:30 p.m. the following day, someone forced the lock from the gate to the compound at All-Trailer Ontario, 185 Nipissing Rd.

Two tanker trucks were jacked up and their wheels removed. The trucks were then lowered onto blocks.

In all, 12 wheels were taken. The Michelin and Bridgestone tires alone were worth about \$400 each, and were all mounted on Accuride rims.

Investigators hope someone saw something that might help with the investigation, or knows where the stolen tires were taken.

If you have any information that leads to an arrest in this or any other case, you may be eligible for a cash reward of up to \$1,000.
