Lee fends off Gerry Brooks

Barry Lee will serve a third term as Nassagaweya's regional councillor after beating a council colleague.

The nine-year town councillor, first elected to regional council six years ago, squeaked by Councillor Gerry Brooks in Wards 1 and 3 by 211 votes (unofficial results).

Mr. Lee, who was acclaimed last time around, led the two-way race through the night with the exception of the first poll results posted at 9 p.m.

A seven to four count in Mr. Brooks' favour came out early, but it wasn't an indication of the final tally.

Although receiving strong support in his Campbellville constituency, Mr. Brooks couldn't pull the rabbit out of the hat.

"I've been consistent and tried to avoid playing politics," Mr. Lee said while watching the election results at the Milton Lions Club Hall.

"My motives for running were the same as they were nine years ago. I really haven't changed."

Erica Andrew swamps rivals

With a politically incorrect activist and relative unknown providing the competition, longtime educator Erica Andrew steamrolled up the middle to become Milton's new public school trustee.

Stating that she would rather hear election results all at once than bit by bit, the former Halton Women Teachers' Association president didn't arrive at the Lions Hall until shortly after 10 p.m.

By then, with just over half the polls in, she had 1,165 votes — compared to Paul Tate's 398 and 359 for Reverend Ken Campbell.

"It's really not my style (to assume premature victory), but I'm very pleased with how things turned out," said a somewhat reserved Ms Andrew. "I think I got my point across that I'm very committed to students and the school system."

Conceding defeat moments earlier, neither Mr. Tate nor Rev. Campbell appeared surprised over the results.

Describing himself as "the candidate from nowhere," Mr. Tate said Ms Andrew is very capable of assuming the trustee's seat.

"I really didn't campaign at all, other than the allcandidates debates. However, I was happy that I had a chance to help educate the public on the issues surrounding Bill 160," he remarked.

Rev. Campbell — by contrast — felt a largely "politically incorrect" campaign cost him a serious run at the school board position, but did allow him opportunity to air his views.

Speaking in favour of Bill 160 throughout the campaign, the religious founder of Renaissance Canada said he will "celebrate" if the controversial legislation




