He worked with a team including municipal employee Darlene Davidson, who has been designated web master and will update and monitor the site, Pat Kossup of the corporate services department and economic development co-ordinator Bob Smith.

The site is located at www.town.milton.on.ca and is organized

in a layered arrangement with seven items on the main menu including: Mayor and council, departments and services, insider information, a comment book, and e-mail.

In addition to the web site Town Hall has also installed a touch screen computer for looking at assessment information. Eventually the web site will be connected to the assessment listings.

In January the web site will also provide access to the weekly council agenda.

"We are pretty excited about going on line and future expansion," said Ms Davidson.

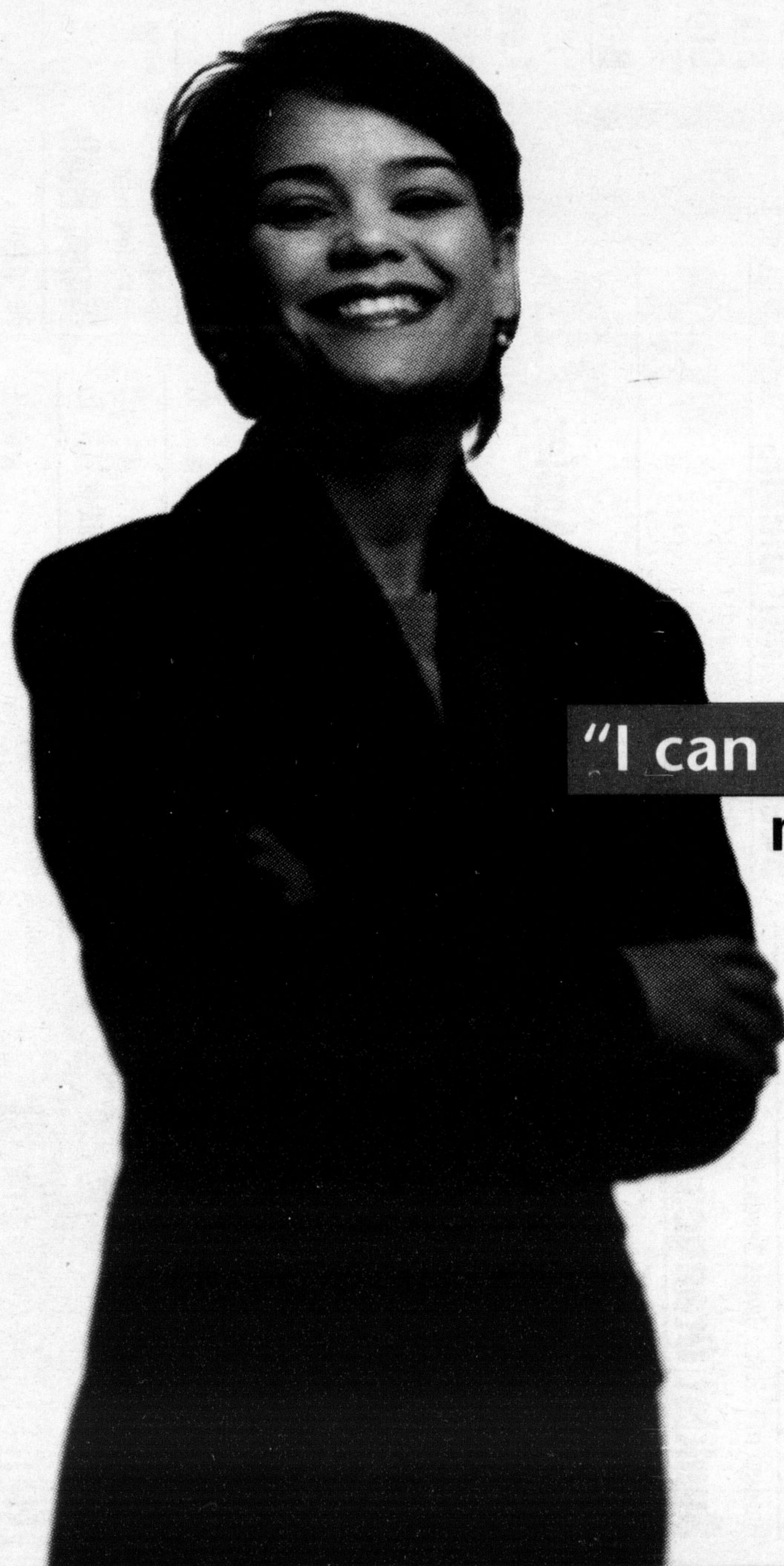
"We will work with individual departments to make sure the site is updated regularly."
