As the term for Milton's current town council ends, three members who will not be returning in December were given plaques in recognition of their contributions.

Councillors Marion Howard and Gerry Brooks, both previously representing Nassagaweya, and regional Councillor Colin Best, representing urban Milton, were given a chance to speak of their time on council.

Ms Howard, who during her six year tenure occasionally allowed her frustrations to come through, said she had a four-word speech but assured councillors it was not full of four- letter words.


"It's been a slice," she said, explaining that her two terms have been "an important slice" of her life. She called it a tremendous learning experience and a great way to get to know your neighbours.

Mr. Brooks, who made an unsuccessful bid for a regional council seat, said he learned a great deal during his two terms.

"Some staff might disagree, saying I know only a very little," he laughed. "However, I have received much help from staff over the years."

Colin Best, a member of town council for 17 years, the last three as a regional councillor, said new council members do not know what they've gotten themselves into.

He thanked staff, previous councillors he worked with, and Mayor Gord Krantz. Mr. Krantz defeated Mr. Best by approximately 1,000 votes in the recent mayor campaign.
