"We have to understand the real cause of where we are at, before we start looking at where we are going," he said.

He regrets that employee groups were not brought in and asked where they thought cutbacks could be made to help balance the budget.

He said such a plan would bring new ideas and help build a positive relationship between the board and its employees.

Mr. Kingsbury was proud of grade 3 results achieved in Halton Region during recent province-wide testing. He said Halton was number one among public school boards in reading, writing and math. When separate school boards were included the Halton public board still ranked number one in reading, and number two in writing and math, which provides a net score of first in the province.

He acknowledged that Halton has some big advantages in its population base. Unlike Toronto, immigrant English difficulties and socio-economic factors do not keep average test results down.

He believes corporate donors should have input into curriculum, explaining that they have the best handle on what skills will be necessary in the future.

"We are looking to produce well rounded children," he explained. "We want lifelong learners, we want to encourage athletics. It's all part of being well-rounded. Above all we want children to be employ-

The trustee said the school system cannot be afraid to make mistakes because then they risk not doing anything at all.

"Without change you won't improve," he said. "You learn something from fail-

## Halton Region urges people not to trash aluminium cans

Don't throw those aluminum pop cans away — ever.

That's the message Halton Region and an industry recycling organization, CSR: Corporation Supporting Recycling, are sending.

The joint venture will see a total of \$55,000 spent on a regional advertising campaign — dubbed "Don't Trash Cans" — to increase aluminum recycling.

"Right now aluminum cans are the primary engine driving the revenue base of municipal recycling programs, but they could be even more important to the system," said CSR president and CEO Damian Bassett.

Halton Region and CSR's target is to boost aluminum can recycling by 32 tones by the end of 1997. This amounts to an additional two million cans
