Filter test results look good Dateline

Results from the first three months of testing the Zenon filtration system at Milton's waste water treatment plant are in and appear promising.

Brent Marshall, Halton's commissioner of public works, said some deviation between individual tests has occurred and adjustments in the Zenon process have been made.

Overall, the test results show substantially cleaner effluent than required by the contract between Halton and Zenon Environmental. There were 41 tests taken.

The project is designed to demonstrate the performance of the filtering process and associated costs.

According to Mr. Marshall's report Zenon will undertake some modifications in equipment, controls and filter membranes.

"There have been a number of scheduled shutdowns in the process which do not have to occur. Changes to the operating plan will make it a better plan for Halton Region," said Zenon chief executive officer Diana Mourato. "The results are very good."
