

Holiday season tragedy

Two local men killed in devastating crash

Tragedy struck a pair of local families just prior to Christmas when two Milton men were killed in a car crash.

Bradley Madill, 43, and Einar Wergeland, 45, suffered fatal injuries as a result of a two-vehicle collision last Tuesday evening.

The accident occurred on Derry Road between Fifth and Sixth lines shortly after 8 p.m.

According to police, an eastbound vehicle driven by Mr. Wergeland lost control — likely due to overcompensation for road sleekness — on the S-Bend and entered the westbound lane.

Mr. Madill's westbound vehicle then struck the car head-on.

Mr. Wergeland was pronounced dead at the scene while Mr. Madill was transported to Milton District Hospital but later died as a result of his injuries.

No other people were in the vehicles.

A campaign manager for Rick Malboeuf during this spring's federal election, Mr. Madill of Farmstead Drive was an active member of the Reform Party and sales representative with Argyle and Broadstreet, an agency in Etobicoke that sells com-

puters.

"This has really thrown me," said Mr. Malboeuf upon learning of the crash Wednesday morning.

"Brad and I met through the Reform Party in 1993. He was a strong family man and just a really nice guy."

Mr. Madill is survived by his wife Mary and his teenage stepson Eric.

Survived by wife Sharon and daughters Michelle and Rebekah, Mr. Wergeland of Fifth Line was a skilled carpenter for more than 25 years and an active member of Calvary Baptist Church in Oakville.

Funeral services for the two men were scheduled for yesterday and today.

The service for Mr. Wergeland, who was born in Mission, B.C., is being held at Calvary Baptist Church today.

Ms Cameron said the largest single donation was \$2,500 provided by the employees of Rockwell International, now known as Meritor.

One man, who insisted on anonymity, made a personal donation of \$1,000, Ms Cameron said.

The Christmas Bureau Fund has been in operation through the Canadian Champion for more than 10 years.

Preston Manning coming to town


Preston Manning, leader of the Reform Party of Canada, will be at the Milton Optimist Centre on Thursday, Jan. 15.


Mr. Manning, representing the official opposition in parliament, will give a breakfast speech at 7:30 a.m.
