


# Police search for pursuit suspect

Police are trying to track down the driver of a stolen jeep in connection with a high-speed chase from Milton to Peel Region early Thursday.

It began after a Halton Regional Police officer followed a jeep that had sped off quickly from the intersection of Ontario Street and Broadway Avenue shortly after 3:30 a.m.

The officer tried to pull over the vehicle on James Snow Parkway, but the driver refused and drove onto Hwy. 401, said Det. Sgt. Jackie Gordon.

The pursuit continued at high speeds off the highway, south on Trafalgar Road, east on Derry Road, south on Winston Churchill and into a northwest Peel residential area.

At this point, Peel Regional Police joined in the pursuit, Det. Sgt. Gordon said.

But the driver of the jeep slowed down the vehicle as if he was going to stop, and then quickly jumped out and ran into a wooded

A search with the canine unit failed to track down a suspect.

The jeep, which was reported stolen from Toronto, had damage to its ignition and contained stolen stereo equipment. The vehicle came to a rest against a snow bank, police said.

No one was injured.

The suspect is described as white, 20 to 30-years-old, stocky and about six feet tall.

## Jury is chosen in Shepherd murder

A nine-man, three-woman jury was selected late last week in the first-degree murder trial of Keith Madeley.

The jury selection process, which lasted four days, wrapped up Thursday afternoon.

At press time yesterday, legal arguments were being hammered out and the jury was expected to hear evidence in the afternoon.

Mr. Madeley, 25, is charged in connection with the murder of 77-year-old Fred Shepherd, whose body was found March 7, 1995 on his Steeles Avenue property atop the Niagara Escarpment.

The trial is expected to last four to six weeks.
