GTA mayors ask for legal change to allow photo radar

Municipalities in the Greater Toronto Area (GTA) will press the provincial government to use photo radar and red light cameras at stoplights.

Recently in Brampton mayors and regional chairs from the GTA agreed to write Ontario Transport Minister Tony Clement in hopes of convincing the province to change the existing legislation.

The Highway Traffic Act does not permit the use of photo enforcement technology because the law attributes any type of traffic violation, such as speeding or unsafe lane changes, to the driver and not the registered owner of the vehicle.

"I don't buy the argument that the province is giving us," said Aurora Mayor Tim Jones. "It's a need-

ed service."

British Columbia has approved photo radar on a trial basis, said Peel Regional Chair Emil Kolb, and the City of Mississauga plans to go ahead with the program even though Peel Regional Police have no authority to charge drivers.

"Mississauga is going to install it (photo radar) even if we can't charge drivers," said Mississauga Mayor Hazel McCallion, who intends on sending warning notices to motorists. "I hope we can convince the government."

Photo radar was first introduced on Ontario highways by the former NDP government in 1994, but was cancelled by the Progressive Conservatives.

Town wants business sponsorship

Hand in hand with attempts to get money from sponsors, the Town of Milton will adopt guidelines.

One of the key planks in the guideline policy is that the Town will accept alcohol advertising, but only when youths are not involved. The Town will not accept tobacco sponsorships dollars at all.

Much of the detail comes from a similar policy adopted by Aurora, according to a report by Jennifer Reynolds, the municipal leisure services director.

There are a number of areas where sponsorships have already been implemented such as the Santa Claus Parade, arena board advertising, at Canada Day festivities, and in the Lions Sports Park.

There were questions from councillors on the potential of issuing tax receipts for donated goods or services. Town staff said clarification will be made with Revenue Canada on the issue. Currently, donations must be quantifiable and they must meet criteria which distinguishes them from saleable goods, according to municipal director of corporate services Jim McQueen.

Councillor John Challinor pointed out that there is no tax receipt issued when someone purchases a hospital lottery ticket, even though such a purchase is in essence a donation to the hospital itself.

According to Mr. McQueen the Town has only issued tax receipts for donations that were tangible with an appraised value.

Mr. Challinor said the Town should consider selling the name of local facilities to a corporate sponsor. He explained the practice has already been occurring "through the back door" by naming parks after service clubs which contributed to them.
