dren. The jury also saw photographs of Mr. Sheppard's property and his slain body for the first time Thursday afternoon during testimony by ambulance attendant Steve Reinhardt.

He was the first to declare Mr. Sheppard dead.

He told court that he discovered foot prints on the toilet seat, a set of keys near the outhouse and expressed his thoughts to police that the scene looked "fishy."

Court has heard the retired man's long-time Niagara Escarpment home -- located half-way up the Steeles Avenue hill -- had no hydro or running water.

He was often seen by neighbours working in his vegetable garden and his beloved five dogs were an attraction to local passersby.

The jury trial, which began January 19 and was expected to continue yesterday with more testimony by Dr. King, is estimated to last four to six weeks.

Mr. Madeley has pleaded not guilty.

was shaping four diverse organizations into one unit that for the first time could communicate over a single radio band. Even geographically, said Insp. Van Der Lelie, Halton was "ill-suited" for regionalizing a police force.

"For a while we went through growing pains," he said.

Insp. Van Der Lelie reminded everyone of Mr. Harding's progressive contributions, such as the Safety Village and community consultation.

"He left us many legacies," he said. "Community policing is the hallmark of our organization."

Insp. Van Der Lelie touched on just some of the changes that have occurred over 25 years, everything from more women in policing and better equipment to bringing the service along technologically.

Media Relations Officer Sgt. Frank Phillips outlined a calendar of special events the police have planned for the year: It includes participation in Citizenship Court (Feb. 12); the Ontario Special Olympic Spring Games (May 7-10); Police Awards Night (May 12); Multicultural Day (July 5) and the Police Tattoo (Aug. 22). A ball takes place Oct. 24 at Le Dome in Oakville.

"I love a party," said police services board vice-chair Tony Gabriel.

Also in the works are commemorative Wilkinson Swords, a museum display at the Halton regional building, a book tracing the history of policing in Halton and Police Week displays and open houses.

"We have a busy year ahead of us," said Sgt. Phillips. "I think it's going to be a very exciting year."

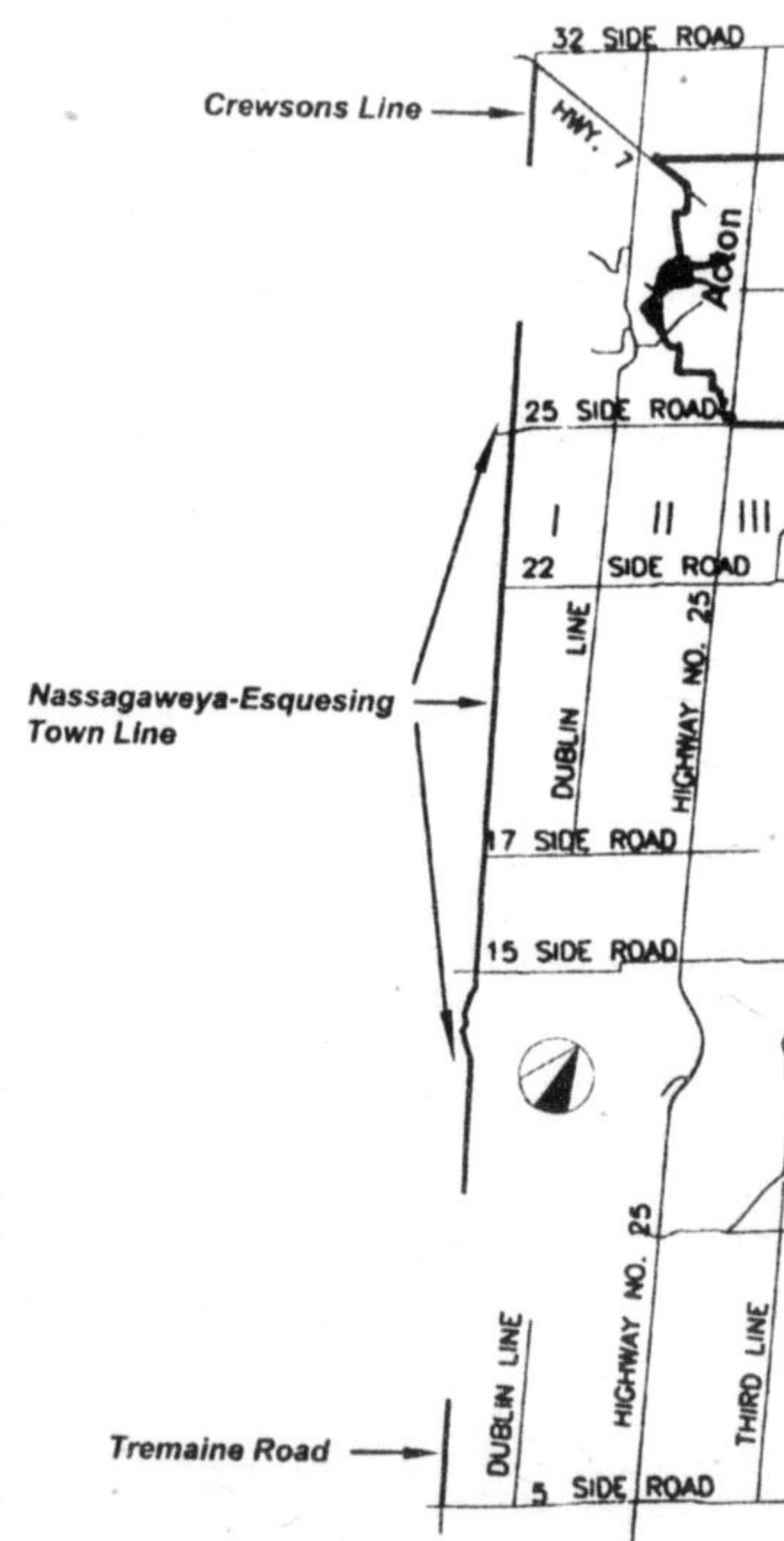
