

Informant promised \$4,000 for alibi

According to the informant he was to be paid \$4,000 to say he had seen two men, dressed in particular clothes, shooting into a shack on the property. He was supposed to say he was in the area riding a dirt bike. The story would create an alibi for Mr. Madeley.

If the story failed he was offered a further \$6,000 to enlist the help of The Outlaws motorcycle gang, to spring Mr. Madeley from custody.

The escape plan called for four or five vehicles to trap a police prisoner transport van.

The informant said the escape plan was possible due to lax security but not likely to happen, given the disposition of his acquaintances attached to the motorcycle group. He explained he had done business with members of the gang in connection to

selling stolen merchandise and narcotics.

"Mr. Madeley wanted to pay me \$4,000 to secure him an alibi. I was financially vulnerable at the time," said the informant. "He assumed I would think about it, and I did."

The informant was told the money would come from Mr. Madeley's mother and told the court he would only have accepted cash, not a cheque.

"Mr. Madeley had a fantasy that my friends in The Outlaws would have helped him out when in fact the opposite was true," said the informant. "I have unconditional protection. However members of The Outlaws would not have been interested in helping because he was seeing some-

one so young, and because of the shooting in cold blood."

Mr. Madeley's girlfriend, Mr. Sheppard's granddaughter, was 13 years of age at the time.

The Crown has placed into evidence the written instructions given to the informant along with a pencil sketch of the Sheppard property.

According to Crown attorney Brian O'Marra, both sides have agreed to the origin of the written instructions which the informant received. The document is in Mr. Madeley's handwriting, he said.

The trial resumed yesterday (Monday). Mr. Hicks was to resume his questioning of the jailhouse informant.

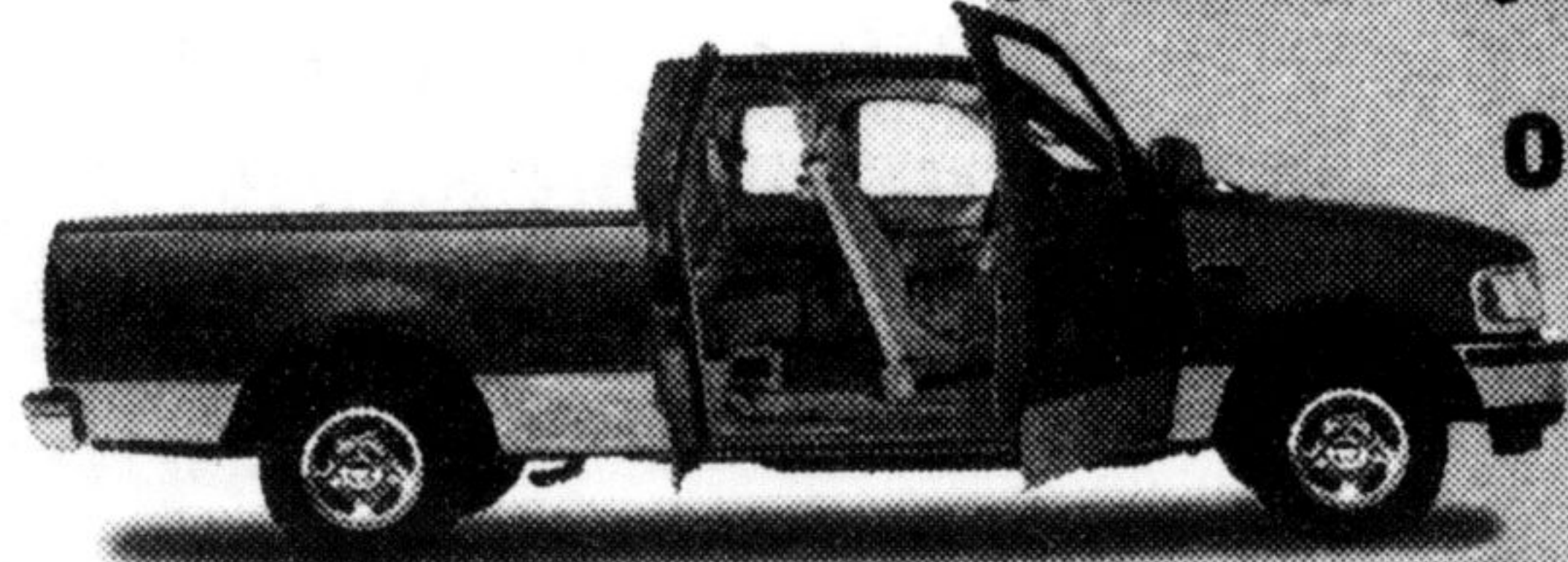
