importance of self-preservation.

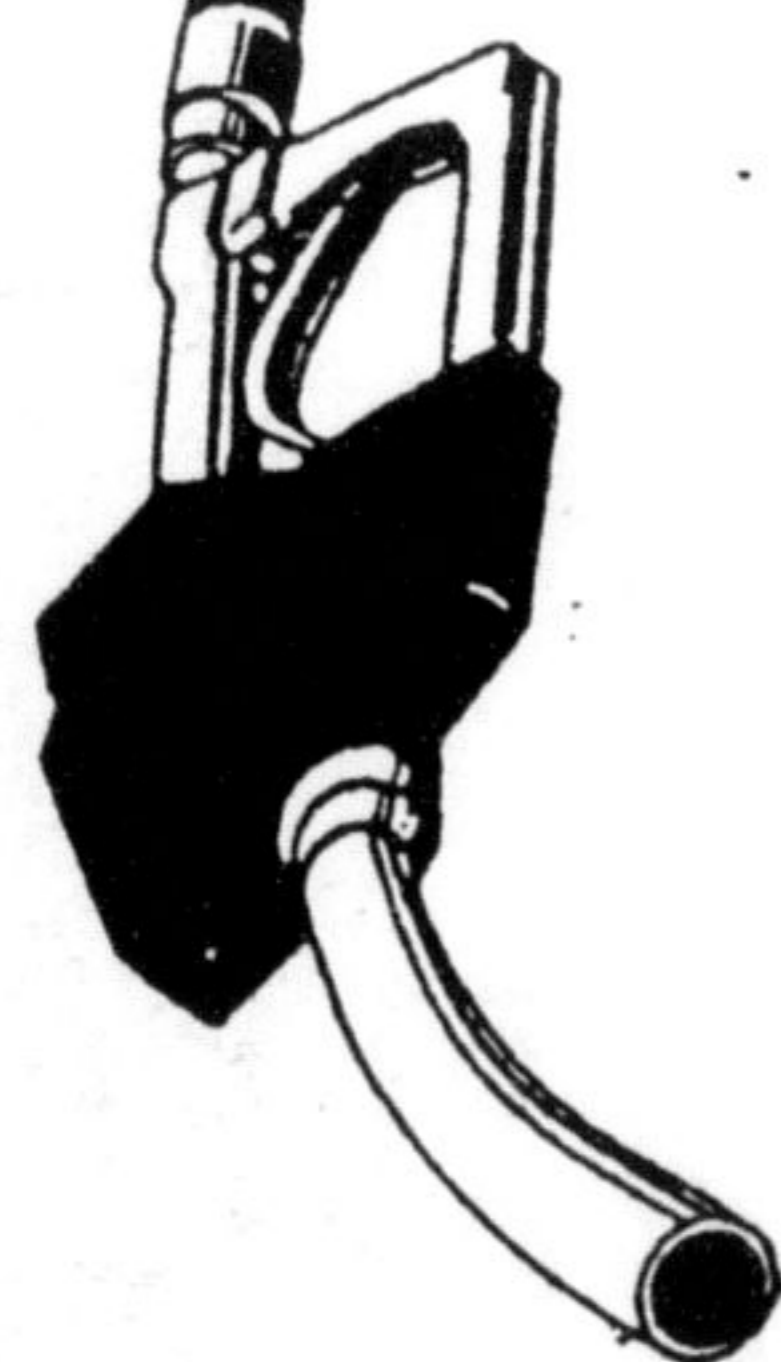
The Wendy Lill play runs from February 18 to 28. Curtain time for all shows is 7:30 p.m.
