well as it should. He stressed such jobs are high paying and satisfying in that they often provide artistic and creative outlets for people.

He said many of the factory tours he has been on have proven his point. He explained that servicing sophisticated robotic stations, tool and die making and metallurgy are among the highly skilled jobs in demand.

Currently there are approximately 48,000 apprentices working for more than 26,000 employers in Ontario. There are roughly 517,000 certified skilled workers across the province.

Most of an apprentice's training takes place on the job and the majority of costs are borne by the employer. There are 67 regulated trades in Ontario.
