Late night complaints lead to arrest

A Main Street party-goer wasn't about to call it a night, not even for Milton's finest.

Responding to complaints about a rowdy downtown hoopla at 3 a.m. Saturday, a police officer paid a visit to the residence, where one of the guests threatened him when asked to reduce the noise level.

Charged with uttering death threats is a 24-year-old Milton man, who'll appear in Milton Court March 25.

Death threat uttered

A 17-year-old Oakville male has been charged with uttering death threats to another teenager from Milton, following a telephone call Saturday night.

The incident occurred at 9:30 p.m. The young offender will appear in Milton Court April 3.

High-tech heist

Thousands of dollars worth of computer equipment was stolen from the Derry Road Medical Centre last weekend, according to police.

Unknown suspects pried open a rear door and proceeded to ransack three separate offices.

A computer monitor, laser printer and fax phone were taken from one office while a monitor, printer, hard drive, television and VCR were removed from another.

The third office sustained minor damage, although nothing was stolen.

Rural home robbed

Thieves made off with a VCR, computer, stereo and jewelry during a break-in on Fifth Line Tuesday.

The robbery — believed to be the work of multiple suspects — occurred sometime between 7 a.m. and 11 p.m.

Entry was gained through a forced rear door.
