## Oakville incidents shake lady drivers

Halton Regional Police are hunting a man who, in two separate incidents, attempted to gain access to cars driven by lone women in Oakville.

The first occurrence took place at 5:30 p.m. on February 10 at Old Mill and Cornwall Roads while the second occurred at 9:30 p.m. February 20 at Old Abbey Lane and Nottinghill Gate.

In both cases, a male tried to get into the front passenger seat but the women accelerated and caused him to fall from the car.

The description of the suspect is similar and detectives feel the same suspect is responsible.

He is described as a white male in his early twenties, of average height, with a slim build and brown hair. He was wearing a black leather bomber jacket, blue jeans, white crew neck t-shirt, black boots and a black baseball cap.
