Police report a number of vehicles were broken into last week in urban Milton and surround-

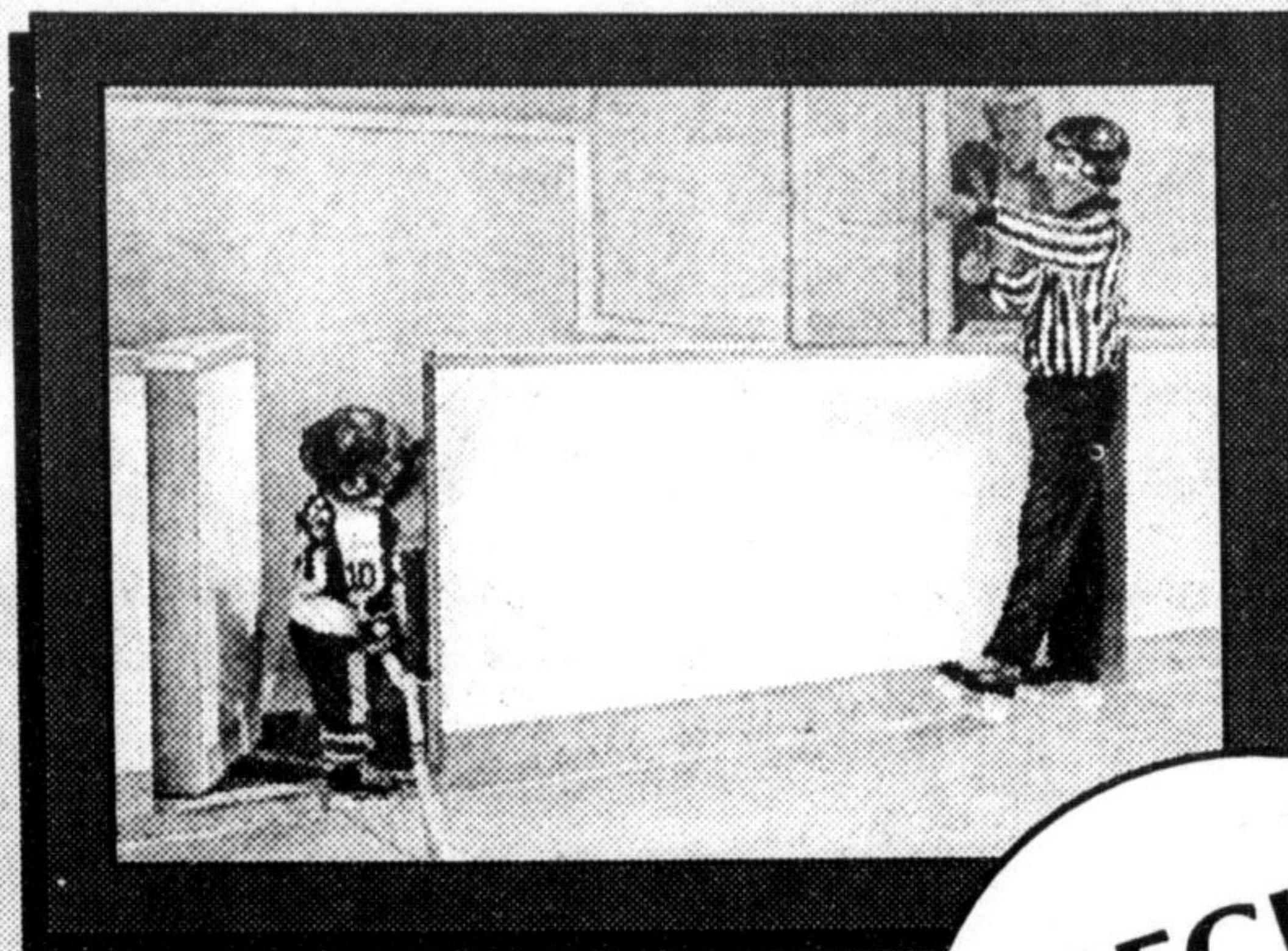
ing conservation areas.

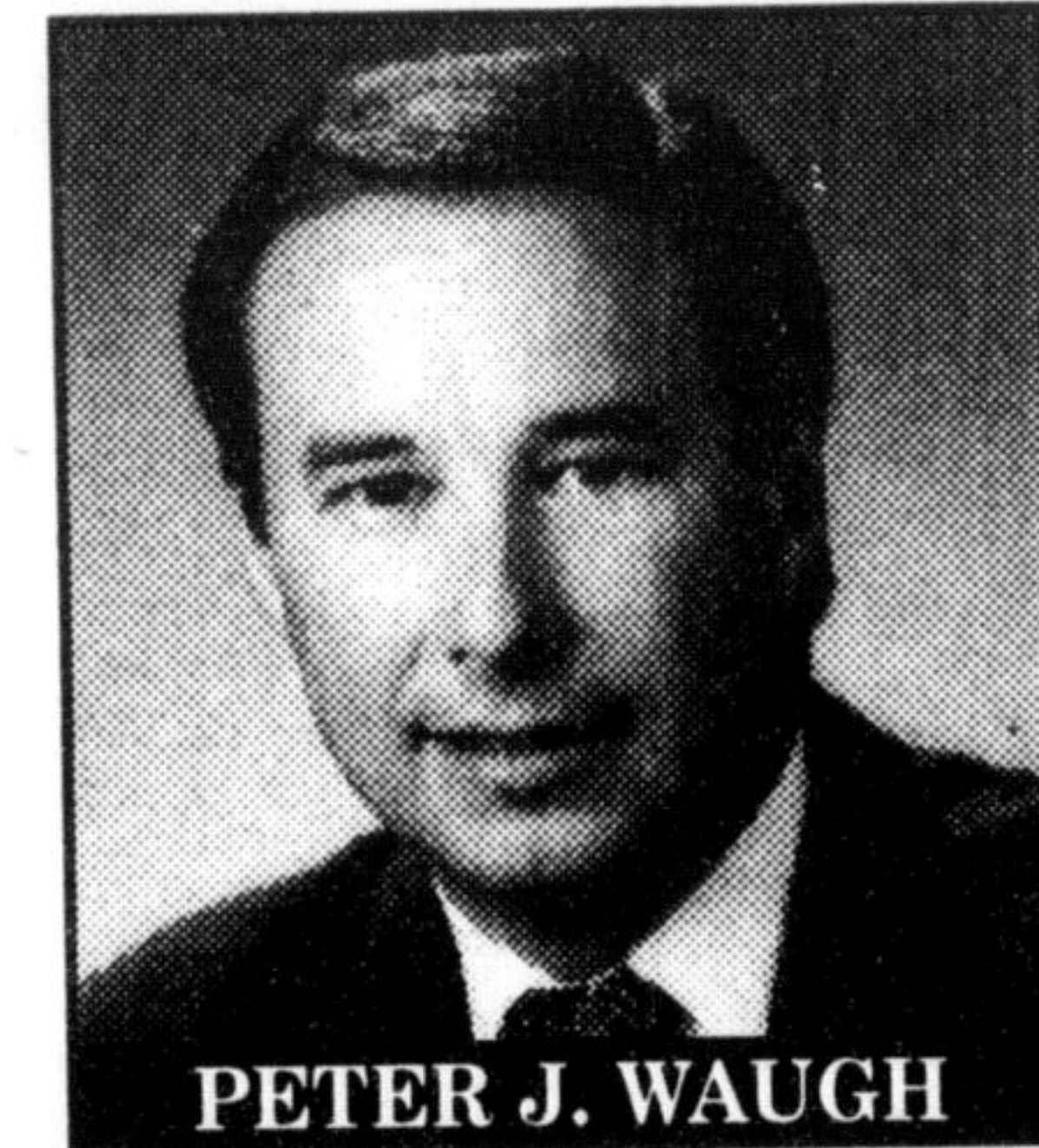
