THE COMMUNITY CARE ACCESS CENTRE (CCAC) OF HALTON APPROVES APPEALS COMMITTEE

The Community Care Access Centre (CCAC) of Halton is a provincially-funded charitable non-profit organization that provides home health care and support services, placement in long-term care facilities and one-stop access to information and referrals to related community resources.

Community Care Access Centres have been established to give consumers a single point of access to a full range of long-term care and community services.

The Community Care Access Centre of Halton (CCAC) is one of 43 Centres across Ontario, created and funded by the Ontario Government as part of its reform of long-term health care in the province. The Community Care Access Centre of Halton has been operational since April 1, 1997.

The CCAC provides the services previously offered through the Home Care Program and Placement Co-ordination Services and also acts as the hub for information and referrals to other long-term care community services, including volunteer based community programs. Home Care services include case management, nursing, homemaking, occupational therapy, physiotherapy, speech-language therapy, social work, dietetics, respite care and palliative care.

The CCAC serves the entire Halton Region. On a given day, there are approximately 4,000 clients receiving services. The largest client group is senior citizens who require nursing and/or homemaking services.

The CCAC works closely with dozens of community and health partners, ranging from family physicians to community support agencies, seniors' residences and hospitals.

The forming of the CCAC is expected to provide ease of access to high quality, consumer-focused services.

At the February 18th Board Meeting, the Board of Directors approved the establishment of an appeals process. Clients and caregivers will have the opportunity to make use of this appeals process where service related issues have not been involved to their satisfaction through the internal issues management process.

A formal appeal process has been developed in accordance with the <u>Long-Term Care Act</u>, to provide an objective review of service issues and to ensure consistency of service provision. Prior to proceeding to appeal, all reasonable attempts will be made to reach a mutually agreed upon resolution between the client/ advocate, the CCAC and the service provider.

The Appeals Committee will be chaired by a member of the Board of the CCAC. The committee membership will include members of the public and service providers. Pending recruitment of additional committee members, a panel of three members of the CCAC Board will hear appeals.
