

they did not want to join. She said in the move towards freer trade agreements the tariff is a bargaining chip which must not be easily traded away.

Ms Mulvale accused Mr. Caldwell of dodging the issue of potential membership in the Auto Pact by Far Eastern auto manufacturers.

"We are not saying times will never change we are only advising our MPs on an issue of great local importance," she

said. "We're suggesting that if you're going to trade anything away, make sure you get something back."

Burlington Councillor John Taylor said auto manufacturers are all "inter-married" with many owing a piece of other companies. In this manner many foreign cars are imported without paying the tariff.

He suggested the recent drop in the tariff from 7.3 per cent to 6.7, which precipitated the discussions at Halton Region, was necessary to fulfill existing trade agreements.

was philosophically opposed to the tariff. He said large auto manufacturers are owned by shareholders around the world. However, because an American based company with Auto Pact privileges owns a piece of a foreign company, they can import those foreign built cars into Canada without paying duty.

Halton Chair Joyce Savoline said the issue was not about tariffs but rather about having a strong bargaining chip in trade
