Mr. Sweeney, who learned about the fraud charge at noon yesterday and hadn't heard from Mr. Deoni at mid-afternoon, said the trustee has three options.

Nothing in the Education Act calls for his resignation unless he is convicted so he can either resign on his own, apply for a leave of absence or carry on as usual.

"Mr. Deoni is a proud man. I'm sure he'll make the right decision about his trusteeship," Mr. Sweeney said.
