'Spice girl' Breisser to find a new spot for biz

A herb packaging business run out of a house in Nassagaweya will be forced to move.

However, the owner will be offered some flexibility in the enforcement of bylaws which require that, Milton council decided recently.

The issue arose when members of the municipal administration and planning committee denied an application for the basement and garage of a 20 Sideroad home to be used in a packaging business.

Cornelia Breisser is running a herb packaging firm on the property, which employs as many as 16 part time workers, according to municipal planning director Mel Iovio.

Councillors agreed to allow more than the 60 days anticipated by town staff to move the business. It was suggested the firm move by Labour Day, however no formal date was agreed upon, only that common sense should prevail.

Mr. Iovio said the property does not comply with the small scale industrial use requirements in agricultural areas, and it does not conform to Halton's septic requirements given the 16 employees, nor does it serve the farming community.

Town planning staff also say that refrigerated trailers, skids and packing boxes are visible from the street, the use is not temporary, allowing such uses undermines the municipal industrial zoning and local roads are not constructed to the standard required by large trucks.

"We accept the decision and are looking for a new location," said Ms Breisser at council. She explained that the business slows in the summer, making that the ideal time to transfer operations. She added she is searching for properties in both Milton and Guelph.

"If this had happened the other way around and they came to town saying they wanted to locate a business here I'm sure the mayor would have taken them out to

lunch and wined and dined them," said Councillor Rick Day.

Ms Breisser said the business uses a six foot by 10 foot walk-in cooler, so time would be required to organize the move. She added that the 10-acre parcel that the house is on is not near large enough to grow the amount of herbs the business requires.
