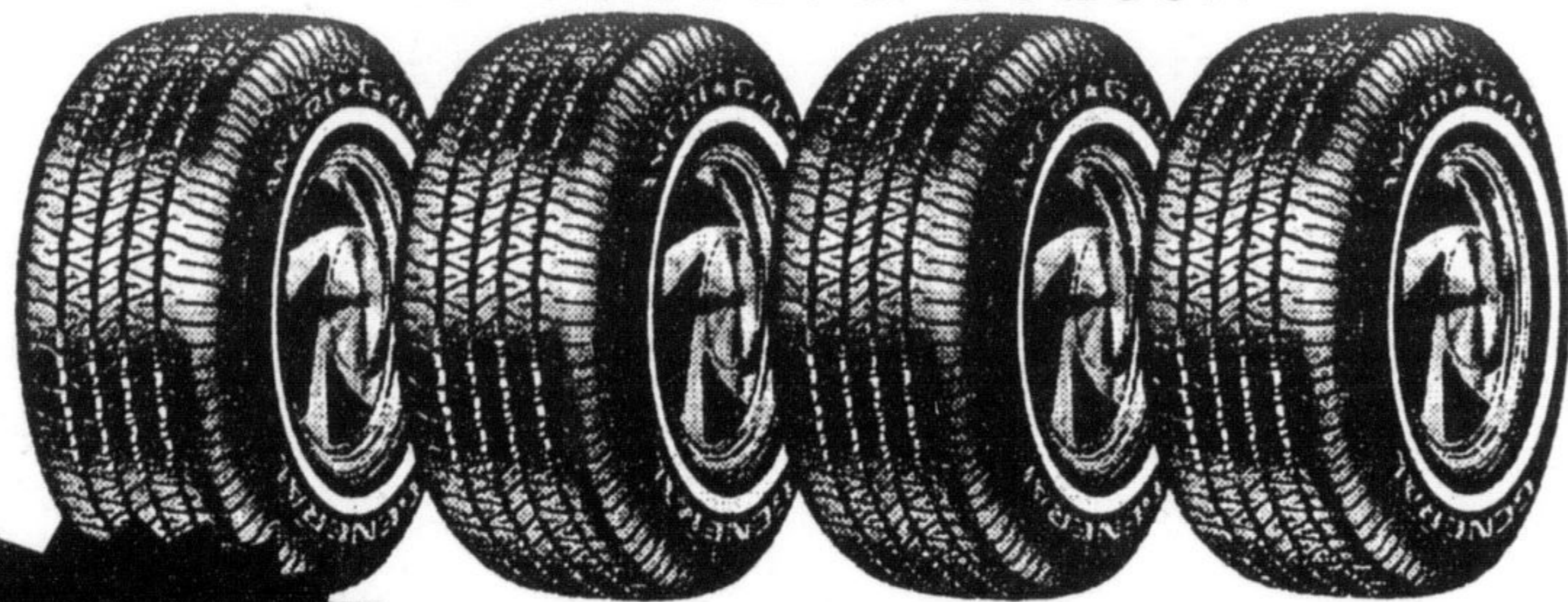

# Chill out, cops tell drivers

The questionnaire sends a message that anger and hostility toward other drivers affects safety on the road and your health. The initiative is the Rangers' second stage in their efforts to put 'Road Rage' back in neutral.

The OPP Highway Rangers have launched another stage in their crackdown on problem drivers.

In conjunction with the Addiction Research Foundation, the OPP has produced 'Test Your Road Rage' cards for road bullies who lose their tempers on the highway.

"Incidents of Road Rage have begun to surface on Ontario highways as a result of drivers climbing into the anonymity of their automobiles and deciding to take their frustrations out on anybody at any time," said Sgt. Peggy Gamble of the OPP Highway Rangers.

"Daily commutes are slowly beginning to develop American like quotients of road bullies and boors."

In the program launched March 24, police will stop drivers caught making derogatory gestures to other drivers or exhibiting similar aggressive behaviour and counsel them on the spot, she said.

The action will include taking the 'road rage' test displayed on the cards.

"Today's highways can often swell with congestion causing driver aggravation and along with these conditions, unthinking gestures can possibly lead to unfriendly face-offs with total strangers," Sgt. Gamble said.

The 'Test Your Road Rage' cards preserve driver anonymity and will be collected by the OPP Highway Rangers for statistical data and problem analysis purposes, she said.

Advice for aggressive drivers and tips for avoiding 'road rage' are on the back of the cards.

Enforcement alone is not enough to solve the problem, said OPP Regional Commander Bill Currie.

"An equal balance of education and public awareness is also required to ensure that we are truly addressing a community problem itself and not only responding to various symptoms of the particular problem."

Dr. Patrick Smith of Toronto's Addiction Research Foundation said the program is an "excellent start" by the OPP to battle aggressive driving head-on.
