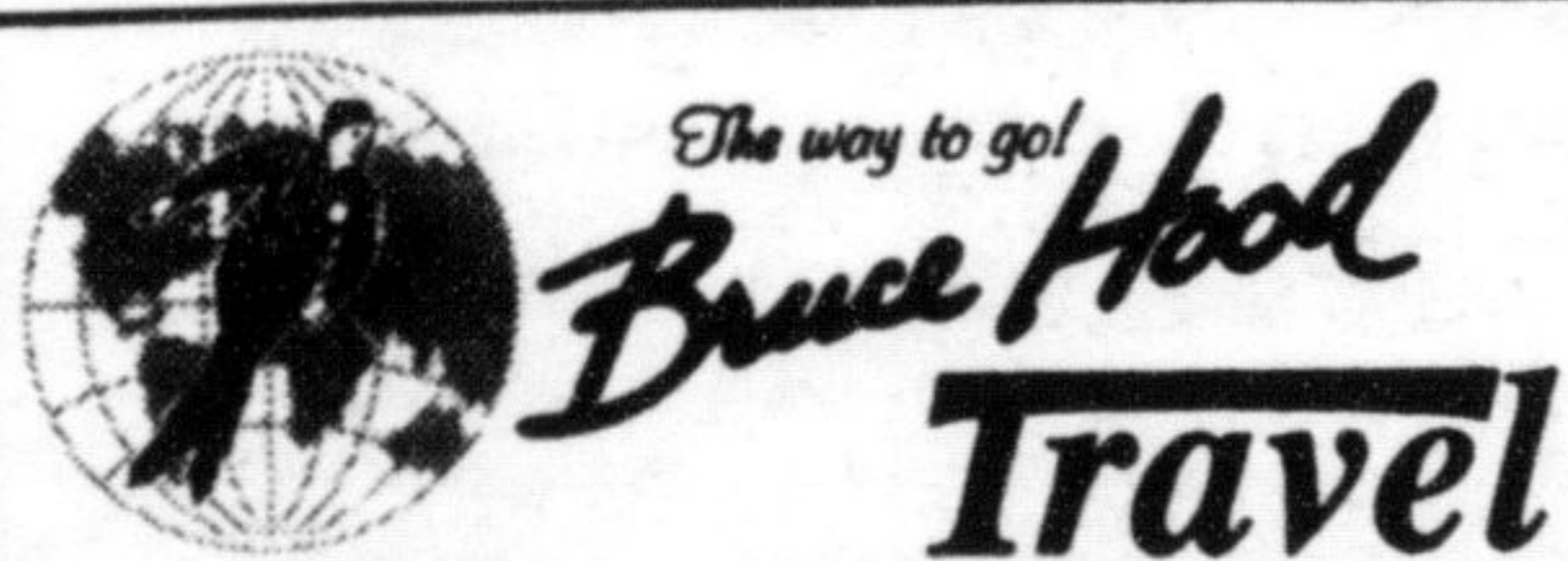

Comet burns less brightly

After months of one horse dominating, the top of the Ontario Jockey Club's Free For All trotting class is beginning to get more congested.

Glory's Comet, who held a virtual monopoly on the class throughout the winter, was upended for the second straight race at Mohawk Raceway in Campbellville.

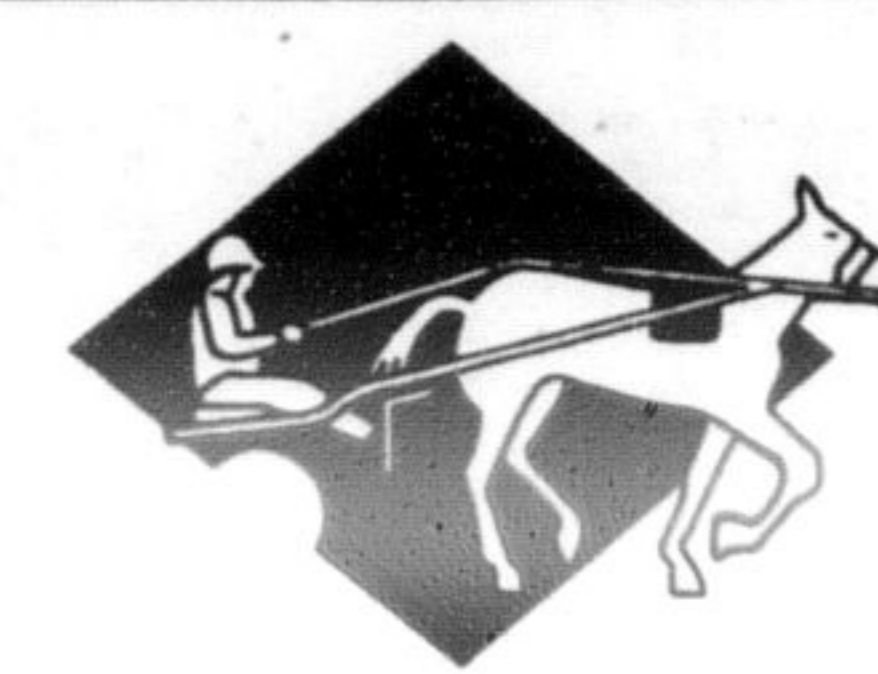
Last week it was Georgia Limited who came through in flying colours and this time it was Lord Stormont's week to shine.

Making just the second start of his four-year-old campaign, Canada's 1997 three-year-old trotting colt champion tipped three-wide around the last turn and nailed pace-setter Hanko Angus steps from the wire.

Goodtimes followed Lord Stormont's cover and finished third, just a head back in the 1:56.4 mile.

"He still needs a couple more starts but he's coming around," said driver Doug Brown, who guided Lord Stormont to 20 wins and \$839,553 in 1997 earnings. "He felt stronger tonight than last week (a fourth place finish)."

Glory's Comet finished fourth while Georgia Limited, who turned in a stunning world record-tying

1:54.1 mile last week, made an untimely break while bidding for the lead and took himself out of it.

On the pacing side, Exclusive Walton made his debut in the Free For All one to remember on April 4.

The five-year-old Walton Hanover stallion found just enough room between horses to split through and stick his nose in front of Raleigh Fingers and pace-setter Armbr Nautilus in a mile of 1:53.3.

Driven by Randy Waples, Exclusive Walton won for the second time in three starts.

"It was getting close to the wire and I was thinking second or third but part of racing is luck and this time it worked out for us," said Waples, who did question his horse's ability.
